







With our second quarter well underway, our Kindergarten students have been very busy learning about children and families from the past and present. While reading stories together, we have been identifying similarities and differences between characters, settings, and events. The students will then use this knowledge to give them a better understanding of what the First Thanksgiving might have been like for children and families. After Thanksgiving we will begin our unit on "Holidays Around The World". In math, we are moving on to reading, writing, and building sets to 20. Our students have even begun to apply addition with these numbers.

Please remember to keep practicing your sight words and number words nightly. As your child is reading each night, make it fun. Have them stop on a word and practice "tapping it out", hunt for a sight word, and use expression! Have a Great Holiday Season!

Terrific Third Grade

Third graders have been working very hard as we move from fractions into area and perimeter. In reading, we are working on non-fiction texts. Currently, students are identifying different text structures an author uses in his writing craft. These text structures include cause and effect, sequencing, and comparisons. Please ask your child to tell you the signal words that shows the text structure. In social studies, we are learning about perseverance. Discuss with your child about what it means to persevere!

It is very important to continue to read and practice multiplication facts daily with your child to strengthen their skills.

Fantastic First Grade

The first grade teachers are very grateful that you helped your child disguise their turkey so well that they are not going to be eaten for Thanksgiving! All the children did a wonderful job on this take-home project. We hope you enjoyed working with your child as much as we loved seeing and hearing their stories.

We are expanding our knowledge of American History with comparing ourselves to how the first settlers lived when they came to the "New Land." Ask your child about the similarities and differences that we came up with in class. In math, we are continuing to learn new addition and subtraction strategies with the use of numbers up to 20. We can identify the relationship between addition and subtraction facts.

In December, we will be traveling around the world learning about holidays and traditions celebrated in countries such as Italy, Israel, Germany, Sweden, and Mexico. On December 19th, we will be having our Polar Express Pajama Party. We will be reading the book Polar Express and completing many reading activities. During the Winter Break, please remember to read every night!

Fabulous Fourth Grade

We are so proud of our fourth grade students! They are working hard in reading, math, writing, and science. All of our students are close to finishing their first full essay, which is complete with an introduction, body paragraphs, and a conclusion. As the year ends, students will begin to write their own essays with more independency. Math instruction has shifted to making sure students achieve mastery of 2 x 2 multiplication and long division. These are critical math skills, so please make sure your child gets any additional help that he/she may need. Our focus in reading right now is on identifying theme, key details, character traits, and inferences as they relate to literary text. We are excited about our first field trip to the Stranahan House Museum on November 13th!

Sensational Second Grade

Second grade students have been working hard already in the 2nd quarter! We are working on improving comprehension skills in all areas. We encourage parents to make sure that students read every night and talk to them about what they read. It's also important that our students can explain how they got their answers and why they are correct—have them prove it! In writing, we are working on information pieces. Your child will choose a subject that they know a lot about as the topic of their paper. We practice in class, however, students should also practice at home with some guidance from you. In math, we are learning about shapes and fractions. Also, we are getting ready to move into two and three-digit addition and subtraction of numbers. In Social Studies, we are learning about the different Native American tribes and their cultures. In science, we are learning about energy, and force and motion.

Please continue to check your child's work when it comes home and sign behavior sheets when needed. Thank you!

In Math, students will be learning decimal place value through the thousandths period and adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing decimals.

Head start just started a new study on Clothes. We noticed that the children are very interested in clothing. They talk about clothes, put them on and take them off, compare clothes, and add clothing details to their drawings. We think clothes will make an interesting study. As we study clothes, we will learn concepts and skills in literacy, math, science, social studies, the arts, and technology. We'll also use thinking skills to investigate, ask questions, solve problems, make predictions, and test our ideas. Parents have been involved by bringing in clothes for us to investigate. We have had a blast looking at different types of clothing!

We are also continuing to learn our letter names and sounds. We have made so much progress since we started school in August! We also have been counting to 20 and writing our numbers. November is an exciting month and we look forward to learning about Thanksgiving as we share what we are thankful for and learn the story of Thanksgiving.



Nurse's News

Food handling errors and inadequate cooking are the most common problems that lead to poultry-associated foodborne disease outbreaks in the United States. Follow these three food safety tips to help you safely prepare your next holiday turkey meal.

- **Safely thaw your turkey.** Thaw turkeys in the refrigerator. Never thaw your turkey by leaving it out on the counter. When the turkey is left out at room temperature for more than two hours, its temperature becomes unsafe as it moves into the danger zone between 40°F and 140°F, where bacteria can grow rapidly.
- **Safely handle your turkey.** Raw poultry can contaminate anything it touches with harmful bacteria. Follow the four steps to food safety – cook, clean, chill, and separate – to prevent the spread of bacteria to your food and family.
- **Safely cook your turkey.** Set the oven temperature to at least 325°F. Place the completely thawed turkey with the breast side up in a roasting pan that is 2 to 2-1/2 inches deep. Cooking times will vary depending on the weight of the turkey. To make sure the turkey has reached a safe internal temperature of 165°F, check by inserting a food thermometer into the center of the stuffing and the thickest portions of the breast, thigh, and wing joint.


Music Notes
