





Terrific Third Grade

Third graders have been working very hard learning fractions in math. We started with identifying fractions and now we are comparing fractions. Over the holiday break when a lot of you are baking, include your child in process. Have them show you their knowledge of fractions when adding all the ingredients to the delicious treats you are baking! In reading and science, we are working with non-fiction texts. Our students are learning how to identify the main idea of the texts and finding the supporting details. It is very important to continue to read and practice multiplication facts daily with your child to strengthen their skills.

Fantastic First Grade

The first-grade teachers are grateful for all your help with learning through the pandemic. It has not always been easy, but we thank you for your continued support through this new process of learning. The students have adapted well and are doing a great job. In Reading, we are learning about different types of technology. In math, we are learning about place value. This month in Social Studies, we are learning about Dr. Martin Luther King Jr and understanding timelines. We ask that your child continues to practice their sight words and read to build up fluency. They are more than welcome to do I-Ready but it is not mandatory.

Fabulous Fourth Grade

4th grade students are working on finding whole-number quotients and remainders with up to four-digit dividends and one-digit divisors, using strategies based on place value, the properties of operations, and/or the relationship between multiplication and division, also they are to are learning how to illustrate and explain the calculation by using equations, rectangular arrays, and/or area models. In addition, they are working on solving multistep word problems posed with whole numbers and having whole-number answers using the four operations, including problems in which remainders must be interpreted.

Reading

Students are working on describing the overall structure for example chronology, comparison, cause/effect, problem/solution) of events, ideas, concepts, or information in a text or part of a text.

Science

Students are learning the different states of matter as well as about magnet forces.

Social Studies

Students put their reading skills into practice as they investigate the cause and effects of Florida and the Spanish-American War.

Writing

Students are learning how to deconstruct their first Opinion essay. Students will first learn how to write the Introduction. In addition, students are learning conventions of grammar.

Sensational Second Grade

Second Graders began our Reading adventure learning about **Story Elements**. We used Graphic Organizers and identified Characters, Setting, and Plot of Fictional stories. We learned how to find the Main Idea of a reading passage, as well as determining the moral of a story. As we continue our journey in Reading this quarter, we will continue focusing on this skill and finding Facts and Details in Non-fiction articles.

Second Grade Problem Solvers always enjoy "adding" more to our minds! In **Math**, we have applied our learning by solving for the **sums** of numbers **with and without regrouping**, using three and four- digit addends, writing number sentences and solving for unknown numbers. We ended the quarter with solving for the "**differences**" in subtraction problems, with and without regrouping. Our focus now will be to continue practicing these skills solving problems and using strategies to find sums and differences with three-digit numbers.

Just like the weather, we are moving systematically in science! We have learned about the **Weather Systems and Patterns and Life Cycles**. Our focus will now be on Matter.

We have been "thankful" this quarter for learning about **American History** in Social Studies honoring our heroes and celebrating holidays. We are continuing our journey in American History learning about the Three Branches of Government and all of the amazing citizens in the past who have been inspiring and have made a difference in history.



Happy New Year! Our PreKindergarten classrooms are learning about many different subjects this quarter! Our Theme is Our Community! We are learning about the different places in our community. As you drive around, point out and name different places/things, such as the library, the post office, hospital, the fire station, landmarks, traffic signs, statues, and parks. Talk about the function of these and how they help all of us as a community. We are focusing on alphabet letters and their sounds within each theme. We use the letters to incorporate different skills in oral language and math. We are comparing and describing using the words such as larger, smaller, greater, less than, and biggest/smallest. Try it at home too! Model using the words up, down, on top of, under, in front of, to the side, between, below, and behind while giving your child directions, such as: "Please put the plate on top of the table." We are practicing using our Manners! Remind your child to use please and thank you. It is important for your child to know their address and your name. Help your child to memorize these by singing your address to the tune of "Do you know the Muffin Man?" For example, 5001 Thomas St, Thomas St. Thomas St., 5001 Thomas St, Hollywood Florida!
