Parent and Visitor Access to Stirling Elementary

Maintaining a safe campus is our priority at Stirling Elementary. New guidelines and policies are being implemented districtwide in an effort to better secure our campuses. The District has mandated that once the school day begins, all perimeter gates must be locked. In addition, all visitors entering campus will be asked for identification and will be processed using our STAR system to check in. Students are also asked to wear their identification badges at all times.

Breakfast/Lunch

Breakfast and lunch are offered daily. The price for breakfast is FREE for all students, reduced lunch is 40 cents and full pay lunch is \$2.00. A cafeteria menu is posted on our website. Students will have two entrees or a salad to choose from everyday for lunch. Please refrain from sending fast food, junk foods, candy, carbonated drinks, aluminum cans and glass containers with your child for lunch. Lunch can be prepaid by the week or month. We suggest you use our online service to prepay for student meals. You may pay online atwww.myschoolbucks.com or, if you prefer to send in money, it should be in an envelope labeled with the amount, student name, teacher name, and grade. Lunch money should be taken to the cafeteria in the morning. Please make checks payable to: "Stirling Elementary School." Forgotten lunch boxes/lunch money should be dropped off in the front office.

Please be advised that there will be no interruptions to the classroom. On the way to the cafeteria, students will pick up lunch boxes/lunch money. Parents may visit their child during lunch. Each parent will sit with his/her child at the picnic tables outside the cafeteria. Visiting parents must sign in and out through the front office before meeting their child for lunch.

Birthday Celebrations

If you wish to celebrate your child's birthday at school, please make arrangements at least 24 hours in advance with your child's teacher. Please limit what you bring/send. We recommend cupcakes, donuts or cookies. Do not bring/send in cakes, goodie bags, decorations, balloons, etc. These celebrations should be no longer than 10-15

minutes in the cafeteria. Please bring your ID to the office before going to the cafeteria for your child's celebration. You may only take a picture of your child, as other students in the class may not be photographed.

Attendance

Every absence must be followed-up by a note from home or a call to the office within two days. Our attendance phone number is (754)323-7602. No absence is an excused absence without communication. You will receive an automated call regarding unexcused absences. For further information please come to the school and ask for a copy of Attendance Policy 5.5. Any child arriving after 8:10 a.m. must be accompanied to the office by a parent. For attendance purposes, you must sign your child in and bring proper identification. Early dismissals will not take place after 1:30 p.m. Students will be released to the parents on the registration form and to any emergency contacts listed on the Emergency Contact Card. All students must be signed out through the school office with proper identification.
