Grade 5 Statewide Science Assessment (Wednesday) - Testing remains successful and we are proud of the individual and collective scores that we are seeing. Once all of the data is analyzed, we will capture how we performed as a school and share these results with our learning community. Please encourage your child(ren) to do his/her best and reiterate that these assessments are just like Progress Monitoring 1 and 2, however, they now have many more strategies. It's also important to be on time to school with a healthy breakfast and with plenty of rest.

Making The Grade - As the administration of F.A.S.T/Progress Monitoring #3 concludes, we are extremely satisfied and proud of the results. The Florida Department of Education's Accountability System determines a school's grade based on eight categories: High Standards in Reading (Grades 3), High Standards in Reading (Grades 3-5), Learning Gains in Reading (Grades 4-5), Learning Gains in Reading of our Lowest Quartile (Grades 4-5), High Standards in Mathematics (Grades 3-5), Learning Gains in Mathematics (Grades 3-5), Learning Gains in Mathematics (Grades 3-5), Learning Gains in Mathematics of our Lowest Quartile (Grades 4-5) and High Standards in Science (Grade 5). High Standards/Proficiency equates to a Level 3, 4 or 5 and each category is out of 100 points. Participation is also a key factor of which we strive for 100% (K-5). Our outstanding performance results from students, teachers and staff, parents and families and PTA/volunteers/community partnerships. Once FLDOE verified, we will share with the learning community.

I-Ready Superstars - Congratulations to the following classes as the I-Ready Superstars for the Week: Ms. Gagne- 100% (Kindergarten), Ms. Ferracane (Grade 1), Mrs. Fitzmaurice (Grade 2), Mrs. Banks (Grade 3), Mr. Krajewski (Grade 4) and Ms. Colon (Grade 5). These classes had the highest percentage of combined lessons passed in reading and math. I-Ready access will be available for all students through **Monday, June 30**. September 23, 2025, students will eat based off their meal eligibility status and students who do not have a meal eligibility status will need to pay for lunch until a Meal Benefits Application is processed. The Food and Nutrition Services Department will start accepting online Meal Benefits Applications for the 2025-2026 school year on **Monday, July 14**, 2025, at www.myschoolapps.com.

All students will continue to receive breakfast at no cost under the Universal Free

Breakfast Program. To qualify for additional programs, complete the Meal Benefits Application at www.myschoolapps.com along with the Parent Disclosure Form in the Focus Parent Portal.
