Social Studies

In Ms. McGregor's World History class we have been traveling back in time to the Paleolithic Age and the Neolithic Age! We've discussed how humans went from nomadic hunter-gatherers to settling down thanks to the Agricultural Revolution. We are exploring our first civilization now: Mesopotamia! Students in Cambridge classes are participating in the National History Day Fair and have begun researching their topic: a turning point in ancient history. In Mr. Cerri's class, we did a recent class play on the Constitutional Convention...students have completed their first Current Events research/summary activity of the year. 7th Grade Civics students have the opportunity to travel to Tallahassee in February. Media Center

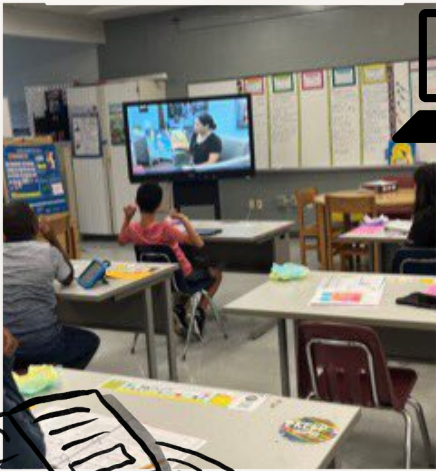

Science

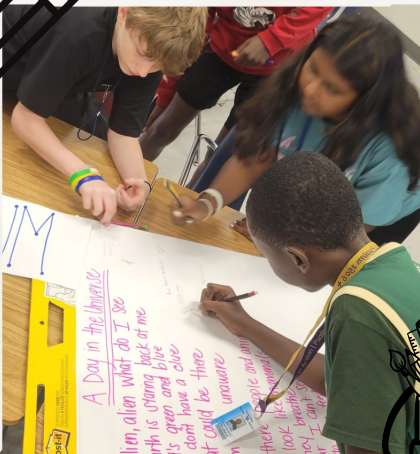
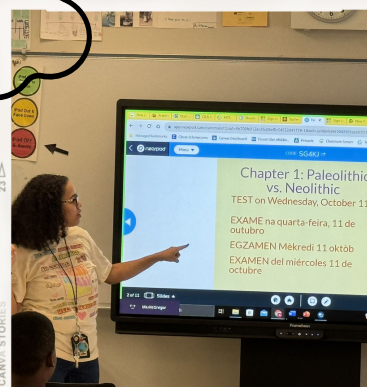

November is the last month of the year containing 30 days.

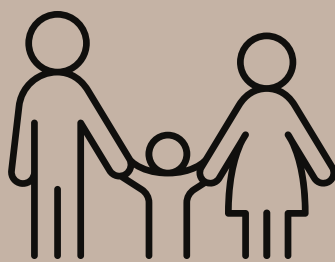
