### Social Studies

Welcome back Wildcats! The Social Studies Department is excited to welcome you back to campus for a great year! Seventh grade students take Civics, which is the study of our government and citizenship. At the end of the school year, all seventh grade students take an End of Course Exam (EOC) which counts for 30% of a student's overall Civics grade for the year. Our teachers have already started teaching about Rule of Law, Due Process, and the different types of governments in the world. Finally, all students should see our new program. Connections to our World, on the morning announcements. Ask your student how civics and history apply to their own lives.



All teachers are beginning topic one. 6th grade is working on adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing decimals. 7th grade is working on adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing rational numbers. 8th grade is working on irrational numbers, square roots, and cube roots. Algebra is working on solving one, two, and multi-step equations. Geometry is working on foundations, proofs, and logic.

# What is VILS?






