How to Help Your Child with Testing:

Help your child become aware when he or she is experiencing test anxiety. When the child can identify that he or she is having test anxiety, help your child to learn ways of relaxing. Help your child learn how to take deep breaths. Other techniques are listening to soft music or visualization. Other activities that lower stress are exercise, engaging in hobbies, art, spending time with friends or family. Communicate with your child: talk to them about how they are feeling, make time for them, play games together. Always encourage your child to try their best. Make sure your child goes to bed early – research shows that being well rested helps students perform better. Keep your routine as normal as possible.
