QUICK REFERENCE GUIDE

This quick reference guide is designed to help guide you through the process of selecting your courses for the 2019-2020 school year. We are on a 4X4 A/B block.

Carefully review the courses listed on your grade level course card.

Review your academic history listed on the back of the course selection card.

Know your graduation requirements and where you stand in reference to them.

Refer to course descriptions for clarification located on our school website under guidance.

Reflect on your experience from this school year. What classes did you enjoy? Were you able to keep up with the workload? Were classes too difficult? Too easy?

Select seven (7) classes: a math class, a science class, a social studies class, an English class and 3 electives.

Write in 3 alternate classes. You may get one of your alternates, so choose carefully.

All students will have an on campus Personalization period.

Off campus study hall is reserved for dual enrollment students only.

Your current teachers will sign next to their recommendation.

Classes with "Pre" require the signature of the teacher currently teaching that course.


Classes like yearbook, newspaper, teaching assistant, peer counseling, drama, music, student government and others **require sponsor approval and/or application.**

Choose a manageable course load.

Final review, double check your selections and confer with your parent or guardian.

Signatures are required from you the student and your parent or guardian.

PE GRADUATION REQUIREMENT

- Students on 24 credit Standard Diploma need to complete Physical Education in order to get a diploma.

- Ways to meet requirement:

1. 1 credit of HOPE **OR**

2. 2 years of JROTC **OR**

Note: .50 credit Personal Fitness AND .50 credit of PE (Band or Dance does not waive the requirement of .5 Personal Fitness).

Note: Dual Enrollment Physical Education courses will satisfy the Personal Fitness portion of this requirement

3. 2 years of a JV or Varsity sport

***3rd Quarter + 4th Quarter + Final Exam = Semester 2 Final Grade (GPA)**


