TV Production I 87721100

Grade(s): 9-11 Pre-Reg: N/A

This introductory course presents industry terminology, procedures and skills in staging sets, performing lighting activities for a production and operation of studio equipment.

TV Production II 87721200

Grade(s): 10-12

Pre-Reg: Successful completion of TV I

This course builds on the knowledge learned in TV 1, and has a large focus on broadcast journalism and preparation for a career in television news. Some students will begin focusing on short story filmmaking.

TV Production III LH 87721300

Grade(s): 11-12

Pre-Reg: Successful completion of TV I and II

Students in this course experience long form broadcast journalism stories and filmmaking. Successful completion of this course enables the student to add the title Studio Assistant to their diploma.

TV Production IV LH 87721400

Grade(s): 12

Pre-Reg: Successful completion of TV I, II, and III

Students in this course focus primarily on perfecting their personal craft, focusing on their own professional goals, whether film or broadcast.

TV Production V LH 87721500

Grade(s): 12

Pre-Req: Successful completion of TV I, II, III and IV

These courses are designed to further the student's personal professional goal in film and television. These courses are offered to students who are committed to completing their second occupational completion point to add the title Studio Technician to their diploma.

TV Production VI LH 87721600

Grade(s): 12

Pre-Req: Successful completion of TV I, II, III, IV and V

These courses are designed to further the student's personal professional goal in film and television. These courses are offered to students who are committed to completing their second occupational completion point to add the title Studio Technician to their diploma.

- **Honors Level Course Note:** Academic rigor is more than simply assigning to students a greater quantity of work. Through the application, analysis, evaluation, and creation of complex ideas that are often abstract and multi-faceted, students are challenged to think and collaborate critically on the content they are learning.
- Advanced Placement Course: Students earn 6 Quality Points on their weighted GPA for these courses; however, to earn college credit, the student must pass an end of the year course given by the College Board.
- **LH Courses:** LH is designated Local Honors. This means that the district has deemed the course honors; however, the state has not. Some scholarships, and post secondary institutions may not consider these courses Honors level.
