### Solar Eclipse Safety

A Solar Eclipse will take place on Thursday, August 21<sup>st</sup>. This will truly be a unique sight to see, however NASA recommends that safety precautions be taken when observing the eclipse. It is not safe to look at a partial or annular eclipse or the partial phases of a total solar eclipse without the proper equipment and techniques. The concern over improper viewing of the Sun during an eclipse is for the development of "eclipse blindness" or retinal burns which could have important adverse effects on a student's eyesight. NASA states that the only safe time to view the Sun

with the naked eye is during a Total Eclipse—when the moon completely covers the sun--which will not be experienced by South Florida. Please take precaution if you plan on observing the Solar Eclipse.

#### **Pinnacle and Virtual Counselor**

Parents and students have access to all of the tools necessary to track and plan for high school graduation and post secondary education. Pinnacle and Virtual Counselor are two extremely important resources to keep students on track and parents informed. Pinnacle provides students access to their class schedule, teacher email addresses, grades and attendance records. Parents can set notifications that will send messages to their email addresses or through texts to their telephones when their students are absent from class or fall below passing grades in their classes. Virtual Counselor helps parents and students track progress for standardized tests, provides up-to-date information on the status of graduation requirements, and allows parents and students to review academic history over time. Take time to review these resources at the beginning of the school year and use them to establish academic goals for each school vear.

### Free & Reduced Lunch

Breakfast and lunch are critical meals for students. Many families across Broward County qualify for free or reduced meals and simply need to complete a short application. Visit myschoolapps.com to apply for free and reduced meal plans for the 2017-2018 school year. Applications are available in English, Spanish, Haitian Creole and Portuguese. ### Advanced Placement, Industry Certification, & Dual Enrollment:

Providing students with a variety of options to meet their future goals is critical. By participating in Advanced Placement courses, completing an industry certification, or taking part in dual enrollment courses, students can transform their high school experience to better prepare for the future. A variety of **Advanced Placement (AP)** courses are available at HHHS. These courses enable students to earn college credit, increase their GPA, and experience courses at the collegiate level. AP courses are available for Science, Mathematics, English, History, Foreign Language and Computer Science. We also have the AP Capstone program at our school.

**Industry Certifications** provide students with opportunities to enter the workforce after leaving high school. Students can choose from Web Design, Culinary, Quickbooks, Certified Internet Web Professional (CIW), Creative Cloud, Microsoft Bundle, and Coding.

**Dual Enrollment** allows students to attend classes at Broward College or Sheridan Technical College to advance their academic or vocational options beyond the traditional school experience. There are also online college options.

### SAT/PSAT Resources

Hollywood Hills High School was the #1 High School in the district for participating in **Vocabulary.com**. Vocabulary.com is an excellent free online resource that allows students to practice and enhance their vocabulary skills. Most of the words assigned are words previously seen on the PSAT and SAT.

Students should also be using **Khan Academy**, another PSAT/SAT resource that is free to Broward County Public School students. This SAT preparation program provides tutorials that teach students why an answer was wrong or right and helps them analyze the possible answers to find the best choice.

Just like last year, all 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade students will take the **PSAT on October 11<sup>th</sup>**. We anticipate a school-wide SAT Day in March for all 11<sup>th</sup> grade students. All 10<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> graders should have been linked last year and have a log in to Khan Academy. Students should be using this online resources as much as possible to increase their SAT and PSAT scores, which will in turn help them with their post secondary goals. Please help your child by monitoring their energy points on Khan Academy in an effort to raise their PSAT and SAT scores. CollegeBoard reports that if a child spends 20 hours

of Khan practice they can increase their SAT score by approximately 115 points.

### Sports Requirements:

The following requirements must be completed before any student can take part in sporting events. This includes participation in all practices and games.

- Pre-participation physical- MUST be a sportsrelated physical (Form EL2)- Yearly
- Consent and Release from liability certificate (Form EL3)- Yearly
- Memorial Health Care System parental consent for treatment- Yearly
- Memorandum of Understanding to play sports for Hollywood Hills High School- Yearly
- Grade Point Average of 2.0 or above (Annually 10<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grades)
- Affidavit of Compliance with the polices on athletic recruiting and non-traditional student participation (Only for students from HHHS that did NOT start with HHHS for their 9<sup>th</sup> grade year)
- Proof of medical insurance with student's name on the insurance card. Insurance can be purchased yearly for school sports at www. schoolinsuranceofflorida.com
- Birth Certificate (For 1<sup>st</sup> time athletes at HHHS)

If core academic changes need to be made, students may come to Guidance on Monday, August 7<sup>th</sup> or Tuesday, August 8<sup>th</sup> from 8:00 A.M.-4:00 P.M. Students will be able to complete a schedule change form during these designated times.

In addition, our entrance times and procedures for arrival and dismissal will remain the same. Parents will be able to drop off students on the east side of the campus. off Sarazen Dr., from 7:00 A.M. until 7:30 A.M. Parents will be able to pick students up from this location at 2:40 P.M. During the hours between 7:30 A.M. and 2:40 P.M., the single point of entry to the campus will be on the west side, across from Stirling Elementary School. Please remember that all visitors and tardy students must report to and check in with the main office. In order to pick students up from school the individual must be an adult over 18 years of age with proof of identification, and be recorded on the approved pick-up form on file with the school. Early dismissal for students is not allowed during the last 30-minutes of the day, and supervision is only provided 30-minutes before and after the start and end of school hours.
