Need Money for College?

There is money available to help you pay for college or technical school. Millions of scholarship dollars are awarded to Hollywood Hills High School graduating seniors - that's not even including Financial Aid (FAFSA)!

What is it? This is the Florida application for state aid including the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship and other Florida scholarships and grants.

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

What is it? The federal government uses this form to determine your eligibility for financial aid, which includes, grants, work-study, scholarships and loans.

How does it work? Your prospective college will try to meet your financial need through aid made up of funds from federal, state, school and private sources. This may include loans, grants, scholarships and student employment.

Institutional Grants

What is it? Money awarded by the college, university or technical center that you plan to attend. These may be need-based or merit-based scholarships. Need based scholarships are primarily based on financial need and often require a FAFSA. Merit-based scholarships are primarily based on achievements, such as academics, athletics, etc. Financial need is not usually a consideration, but it could become a requirement in some cases.

Family Savings

What is it? Family Funds for College or Florida Pre-paid College Plan that may have been purchased.

Other Scholarships

What is it? Based on their own specific criteria, many organizations award free money to cover some or all of the costs of college, university or technical school expenses. Applications are deadline date sensitive and available throughout the entire senior year of high school.

Where to find them? The best resource is our own HHHS Scholarship Bulletin. They are updated bi-monthly and posted on the Hollywood Hills High School website.

Check with parent employers for scholarship opportunities and visit FREE internet resources.
