College-Readiness

WHAT is college readiness?

Being college ready means that you are not showing deficiencies in reading and math, and that you have a good probability of successfully completing college-level courses after high school graduation and will not need to take remedial courses.

WHEN do I show that I am college ready?

During your 11th grade school year, you will be scheduled to take the PERT (Postsecondary Education Readiness Test) in April – May. You do not have to sign up. We select those students who need to take the PERT based on their ACT/SAT/FCAT scores.

HOW do I show college readiness?

You show college readiness by scoring at a minimum the following scores:

	FCAT (10 th gr)	FCAT 2.0 (10 th gr)	ACT	SAT
READING	Level 4 (355)+	Level 4 (262)+	18	440 (Critical Rdg)
ENGLISH	N/A	N/A	17	N/A
MATH	Level 5 (375)+	N/A	19	440

WHY should I be college ready?

Students who demonstrate readiness by achieving the minimum test scores and enroll in a community college within 2 years of achieving such scores shall not be required to enroll in remediation courses as a condition of acceptance to any community college.

Remediation in college courses means you will be PAYING for courses but you will NOT BE EARNING COLLEGE CREDIT! If you have the minimum scores above, you begin earning course credits upon college entry.
