82% Eligible for Bright Futures Scholarships! Even in a pandemic and facing additional hurdles to take the SAT and ACT this year, the majority of CA students have been able to meet the Bright Futures requirements!

For those who have not yet met the scores, there is still time! Students have until JUNE 2021 to earn a qualifying test score. There are national test dates for the SAT and

ACT in April, May and June, and CA is offering a variety of test prep opportunities to help students achieve the scores they need.

2 National Merit Finalists: These students scored in the top 2% of highest achievers on the PSAT. They earn full cost of attendance at a Florida Public University and may earn scholarships from out of state universities...Zakariya Aziz and Emily Odza.

4 QuestBridge Match students: A scholarship covering the FULL cost of attendance (tuition, room & board, books, and more!) at the following universities: Rice University- Alejandra Jimenez, Stanford University- Annie Villata, Tufts University-Nia Goodall, Williams College - Yasmine Faigle
