Who is Eligible to Apply?

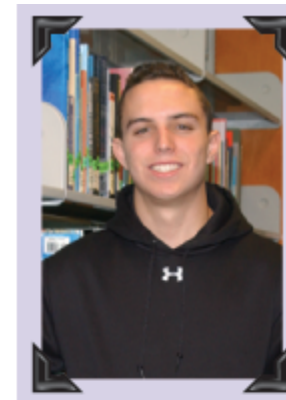
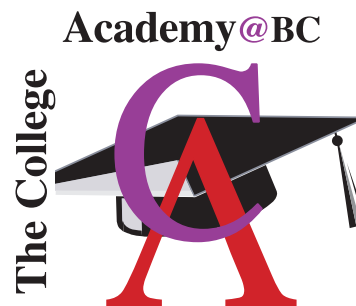
- High school sophomores with 10.5 credits (14 credits by registration.)
- Must be a Broward County resident.
- Applicants must have a 3.25 unweighted average and a 3.50 academic core gpa.
- Exemplary behavior/attendance record.
- Two years of one foreign language are strongly recommended.
- Currently enrolled or have earned a minimum grade of “C” or higher in Algebra I, Geometry, World History, English I, English II and HOPE.
- Must earn required scores on the PERT (Postsecondary Education Readiness Test), or SAT, or ACT.
