

Recently, Broward College has been experiencing some issues with students NOT being able to log into their BC One Access Accounts. This is affecting students who may have applied before and never took courses and are now updating their BC account applications to be current.

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Avoid a HALLWAY Detention!

Attention all Students and Parents/Guardians...

The STHS Magnet Contract is still very much in effect. After repeated conversations with students via this newsletter, on campus announcements, and hallway conversations, the Staff of STHS has unanimously voted to implement Fast Pass Detention Notices to any students who are witnessed to be in violation of the basic expectations as set in the STHS Magnet Contract.

Where teachers will continue to proactively check for all expectations to be adhered to within their classes, the hallways will also be monitored to ensure that teaching and learning is not compromised by basic expectations not being met.

For this reason, any of the following violations will result in an administrative detention. None of these expectations are new, and all can be implemented without any disciplinary consequences with both student and parent support.

- Out of uniform/dress code/No visible ID
- Tardy to school/class
- Not using their school-assigned backpack
- Visible phone and/or listening device
- Using profane language

- Not following directions
- Engaging in horseplay
- Out of assigned area

The detention will take place during the student's lunch within 2 school days of it being assigned. Failure to serve the detention will result in progressive disciplinary consequences, as detailed in the BCPS Discipline Matrix.

Our goal is that students will follow the established expectations, with a focus on their learning environment. We thank you for your compliance and support in this effort.

Fee Waivers: Students continue to have two paths to receive their fee waiver benefits:

- **Requesting a fee waiver directly from College Board:** When requesting from College Board directly, if a student isn't automatically approved, the adult they identify will receive an email to verify <u>student eligibil-</u><u>ity</u>. This occasionally happened in the past, but now the identified adult receiving an email will be an automatic feature going forward.
- Using a fee waiver code from their counselor: If you and your students prefer to use the fee waiver codes, counselors can find the codes in the <u>K-12 reporting portal</u> under the Downloads tab. Contact <u>Customer Service</u> if you need help with fee waiver codes.

Important Update For K-12 Students WIRELESS DEVICE POLICY



WIRELESS DEVICE USE NOT ALLOWED DURING SCHOOL DAY

Effective in the 2024/25 School Year

All wireless devices must be powered off or in airplane mode during the school day, from bell to bell, including passing periods and lunch unless authorized for instructional purposes.

Wireless devices include cellphones, laptops, smartwatches, tablets, headphones, airpods, and other two-way communication equipment.

Monthly Emergency Drills—Required by Law PLAIN LANGUAGE PROTOCOLS

The plain language emergency protocol will eventually eliminate the use of ALL color codes, as required by the federal government and the MSD Commission, that are

currently in place in Broward County Schools. STHS will abide by the required monthly emergency drills as dictated by FL Statute 1006.07 and SBBC Policy 2120.



EMERGENCY PROTOCOL	ACTION STATEMENT	RESPONSE PROCEDURES
HOLD	"Hold in your room or area and clear the halls."	 Non-emergency situation. Business as usual. Clear the halls for emergency movement if needed.
SECURE	"Secure. Get inside. Lock outside doors."	 Danger outside the campus. No entry or exit of the building until "All clear" is given.
LOCKDOWN	"Lockdown. Locks, lights, out of sight."	 Danger inside campus/buildings. Cover windows, lights off, silence. Move into "Safer Spaces". No movement until "All clear" is given.
EVACUATE	"Evacuate. (State reason)."	 Notify Principal/designee. Minimum 300' from buildings. Await further instructions.
SHELTER	"Shelter. (State rea- son and location.)."	 Move all persons into school buildings. Follow directions from emergency management personnel. No movement until "All clear" is given.
ALL CLEAR	"All clear."	Followed by plain language di- rective.

Important Notice: Florida Statute 943.082 states that *if, following an investigation, it is determined that a person knowingly submitted a false tip through FortifyFL*, the Internet protocol (IP) address of the device on which the tip was submitted will be provided to law enforcement agencies for further investigation, and *the reporting party may be subject to criminal penalties* under s. 837.05. In all other circumstances, unless the reporting party has chosen to disclose his or her identity, the report will remain anonymous.



All students, staff, parents, and community members must show valid PHOTO ID to enter campus. Sheridan Tech College and Technical High School require all visitors to check in through a Single Point Entry on the south side of the building. 
Suicide is preventable. Youth who are contemplating suicide frequently give warning signs. Do not be afraid to ask about suicidal thoughts. Nevertake warning signs lightly or promise to keep them secret.

Preventing Teen Suicide: Tips for Peers

Suicide rarely happens without warning. As a peer, you may be in the best position to recognize when a friend might need help and help them get it. You may see signs in person, hear about them secondhand, or see them online in social media. Never ignore these signs.

Risk Factors

- Hopelessness
- Nonsuicidal self-injury (e.g., cutting)
- Mental illness and substance abuse
- History of suicidal thinking
- and behavior
- Prior suicide among peers or family members
- Interpersonal conflict, family
- stress/dysfunction
- Presence of a firearm in the home



Suicidal threats in the form of direct (e.g., "I want to die") and indirect (e.g., "I wish I could go to sleep and not wake up") statements

Giving away prized possessions Talking about death

Sudden unexplained happiness Increased risk taking

Suicide notes, plans, online postings

Making final arrangements
