A.P. Tests – [Advanced Placement](#) exams are quickly approaching. Please check with your A.P. teachers to confirm after school and weekend tutoring sessions.

[SAT](#) retakes – You still have an opportunity to retake the SAT for better admission and scholarship opportunities. May 3 is the deadline to register for the last test of the school year on June 1.

[FAFSA](#) deadline – August 31 is the deadline for submitting your Florida Financial Aid Application for the upcoming college year.

Chase Rubin \$1200 Grant

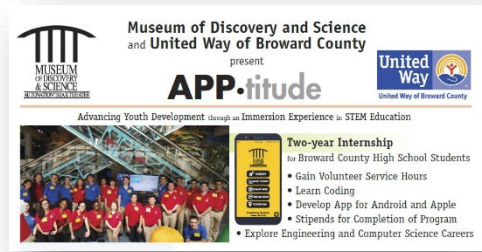

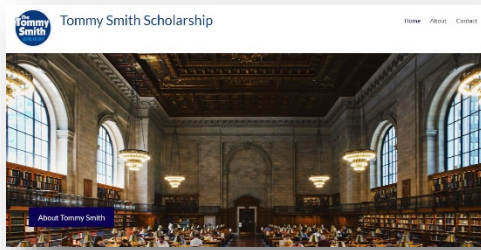


Sophomore Internship Opportunity

Advancing Youth Development through an Immersion Experience in STEM Education. Two Year Internship for Broward County High School Students. Students entering their Junior year in August 2018 are invited to apply for a two-year internship that will provide an opportunity to earn volunteer service hours, college credit and a stipend while advancing their knowledge in STEM education.

The program begins in the fall of 2019 and runs through May 2021 at the Museum of Discovery and Science. Students will meet at the museum a minimum of two times per month and participate in [Florida Atlantic University College of Engineering and Computer Science's](#) three week, dual-enrollment course in Summer 2019. Upon successful completion of this college level course, students will receive three semester hours of college credit.

- Be a current college or university student.

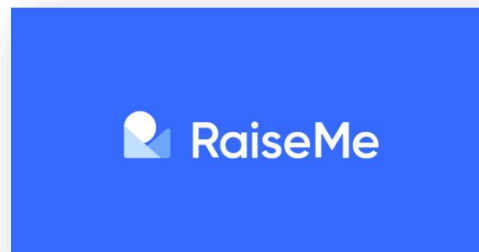
