The Broward Futures scholarship provides an opportunity for incoming freshmen to complete an Associates in Arts (AA), Associates in Science (AS) or Certificate not to exceed 75 credit hours per student. The Broward Futures scholarship will cover the cost of tuition and fees up to 30 credit hours and contribute towards the cost of books and supplies for each academic year (including summer) until the student reaches 75 credit hours.

In February we honored and celebrated Black History. Thanks to the Class of 2020 and the Multicultural Club, who have paired up to proudly present, *The Arts in Living Color*, activities were coordinated during lunches that included line dancing, a poetry slam, trivia contest to a culminating Talent Showcase. ## Practical Nursing Students Engage in Medical Research



Speaking of great resources, Ms. Emma Desir's practical nursing students explored some of those available within our *GALE* Research Databases to fulfill their assigned research task. In an effort to equip them with reliable, authoritative, peer-reviewed, and research-based content, Mrs. Rivera presented the *"Health & Wellness"* database providing health-focused journals, reference material, video, and much more. Students selected any one of a wide variety of research topics from colon cancer screening to helmet safety.

Additionally, clicking on the eBooks tab links students to additional digital encyclopedias focused on various medical related information from body systems to women's fitness.

Criteria for writing their research papers included use of APA format. Mrs. Rivera demonstrated the embedded highlighting, notetaking, citation tools and integration with Office 365, proving to be a much more efficient and effective use of their time. Students walked away with much greater confidence in knowing they had content they could rely on and the tools to help them produce high-quality research papers. While Google may have been their first 'go-to' place to conduct their research, students quickly recognized the benefits for using GALE!

That means 49% of the seniors, 61% of the juniors, 46% of the sophomores, and 50% of

STHS is proud to be a <u>showcase school</u> for Microsoft again this year! Our second batch of freshman students have been working toward Microsoft Office Suite (MOS) certification (maximum allowance three per application). We are very proud of our 74 students, 67 have earned Word certification on their first attempt, February 20! Overall, 234 certifications have been earned thus far by all freshman students; 92% have obtained <u>Word</u>, 83% have earned <u>PowerPoint</u>, 29% gained <u>Excel</u> and 16% <u>Outlook</u>.


