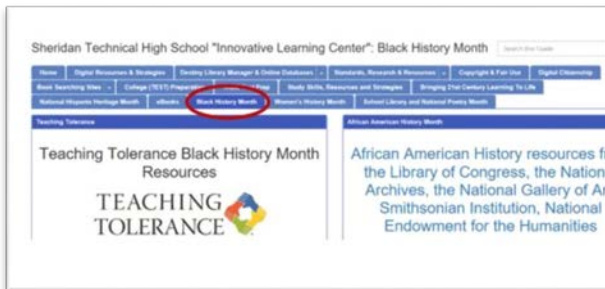

Celebrating Black History Month

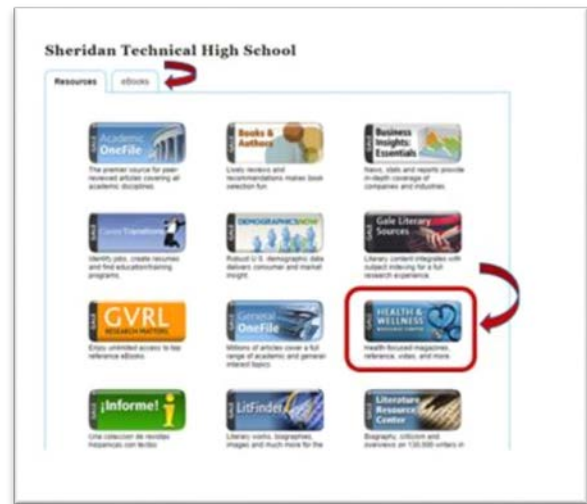


In February we honored and celebrated Black History. Thanks to the Class of 2020 and the Multicultural Club, who have paired up to proudly present, *The Arts in Living Color*, activities were coordinated during lunches that included line dancing, a poetry slam, trivia contest to a culminating Talent Showcase. These have proven to be dynamic opportunities for our students to enjoy and reflect on the legacies left by past and present Black Americans. They also provided our “Morning Howl” news show daily black history facts with a focus on Black people in the arts (i.e. playwrights, poets, writers, musicians, dancers and artists).

Speaking of great resources, Ms. Emma Desir’s practical nursing students explored some of those available within our **GALE** Research Databases to fulfill their assigned research task. In an effort to equip them with reliable, authoritative, peer-reviewed, and research-based content, Mrs. Rivera presented the **“Health & Wellness”** database providing health-focused journals, reference material, video, and much more. Students selected any one of a wide variety of research topics from colon cancer screening to helmet safety.

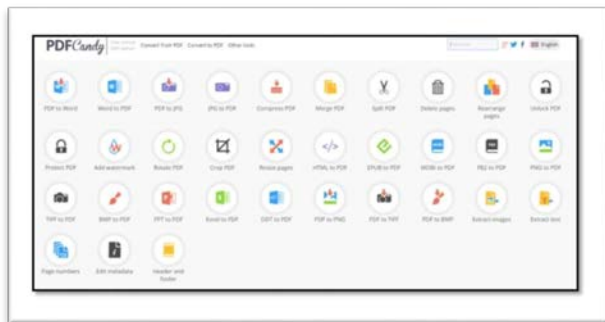
Additionally, clicking on the eBooks tab links students to additional digital encyclopedias focused on various medical related information from body systems to women’s fitness.

Criteria for writing their research papers included use of APA format. Mrs. Rivera demonstrated the embedded highlighting, notetaking, citation tools and integration with Office 365, proving to be a much more efficient and effective use of their time. Students walked away with much greater confidence in knowing they had content they could rely on and the tools to help them produce high-quality research papers. While Google may have been

their first 'go-to' place to conduct their research, students quickly recognized the benefits for using GALE!

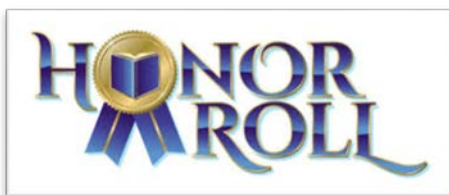
