Frequently Asked Questions

Why should I choose Atlantic Technical College and Technical High School?

Our high school gives you exposure to your career field of interest along with college and career readiness skills. All students will take academic courses that prepares them for college admissions and scholarships, *and* every student will have the opportunity to complete a technical program and earn industry credentials!

How challenging is the work?

It's rigorous. We want every student to qualify for college so all students are challenged to master courses that far exceed the state graduation requirements. Course offerings include Honors level, Advanced Placement, College and Career Dual Enrollment classes.

Will I have access to technology?

Atlantic Tech provides extensive, equal access to technology. The campus is wireless, classes are equipped with laptop carts, ceiling mounted LCD projectors, document cameras, and Promethean Smart Boards. There is even an iPod cart for podcasting!

What type of schedule does Atlantic Tech follow?

The school follows a 4x4 schedule which is similar to many colleges. Students take four 90-minute classes each semester, earning a total of 8 credits for each year of high school. School hours are 7:05 AM to 1:50 PM.

When do I choose my Technical Program?

In 9th and 10th grade, students complete coursework that is required for graduation. The process for choosing a technical program begins in the 10th grade. Students participate in "Tech Tour Talks," for every program; attend the Senior Career Fair and Expo; and meet with the Career and Technical Education Advisor individually and in small groups. Parent conferences by appointment are welcomed. Technical programs begin in the 11th grade. Students will take a total of eight courses in their Tech program during their junior and senior years.

What about clubs and athletics?

Our more than 30 clubs include: Chess, Robotics, Student Government, Key Club, National Honor Society, Business Professionals of America (BPA), Health Occupations Students Association (HOSA) and more. We do have sports club for basketball, soccer, flag football, volleyball and cheerleading. We do have field trips, social activities, dances, Grad Bash and Prom. Students may participate in their home zoned school athletics, band and JROTC programs.

What about transportation?

As a Broward County Public School, free bus transportation is provided for every student who lives north of Sunrise Boulevard and more than two miles from the school.
