Hello Future Kindergarten Parents,

We are so excited for your child's kindergarten adventure to begin. We wanted you to have an idea of some of the *skills that your child will learn in kindergarten*. It would be beneficial to start practicing some of these concepts with your child this summer.

We can't wait for your child to begin school with us!

READING:

- Identify all upper and lowercase letters and sounds
- Identify 88 sight words (provided)
- Recognize concepts of print (cover of a book, title, author, illustrator, punctuation, etc.)
- Identify beginning, middle and ending sounds
- Segment and blend consonant-vowel-consonant (cvc) words (p/a/n = pan)
- Rhyme
- Comprehend stories in picture books (beginning, middle, end)
- Answer wh- questions about reading

WRITING

- Write name with one uppercase letter and all others lowercase
- Write a sentence starting with a capital letter, use 1 finger spacing, and punctuation

MATH

- Count and write numbers 0 – 100
- Count by 10's
- Add number to 20
- Subtract numbers 0 – 10
- Identify two- and three-dimensional shapes
- Use basic measurement vocabulary – taller, shorter, longer, lighter, heavier
- Classify and sort objects

SCIENCE

- Read about topics in science; plants, animals, weather, etc.
- Explore through hands-on activities
