Moreover, the school has been recognized by Broward County Public Schools for its 99% graduation rate – one of the highest in the county – and by the state of Florida for the 5-Star School Award. CCHS has 2329 students, grades 9 through 12, with a culturally diverse population: 54% White, 32% Hispanic/Latino, 7% Black, 6% Asian and 1% Multi-racial or Other. Advanced Placement and Dual Enrollment

In 2016, 901 CCHS students took over 1497 AP tests in 25 subjects, and 53% scored 3 or higher. In 2016, 168 students took Dual Enrollment courses and 16 students were Early Admission students at Broward College, Florida Atlantic University and University of Florida.


