# Social Media Tips for Teens

Follow the rules ...

**Think before you post** 

Do not post or share messages, pictures, or videos you would not want the world to see. You cannot control how information is shared by those who see it, even if you post it privately or later delete it. Remember that you can never permanently erase



something published on the internet. For example, you could face consequences later in school, college interviews, or job applications.

Be cautious of requests by strangers

Play it safe and only accept friend requests from your real-world friends. Do not agree to meet strangers offline; never give away your phone number or address.

#### Be kind

Remember that online communication does not allow you to tell how others feel, as you cannot see their facial expressions or hear their voice. Make sure that what you write cannot be misinterpreted. Be respectful of others' posts, even if you disagree with them. If you wouldn't say something to someone's face, don't say it online.

If you are being cyberbullied, reach out

Tell an adult you trust, such as a parent, teacher, or school counselor, if you or anyone you know is being cyberbullied. Do not delete any communications. Save all screenshots and emails so you can show an adult. Block the person harassing you and make copies of all communications if needed.

**Avoid overusing social media** 

It's easy to get "sucked in" on social media and spend much more time than you intended to on it. But when people spend a lot of time on social media, they are at a higher risk of experiencing negative consequences, such as disrupted sleep and what researchers call "Facebook depression" - low self-esteem associated with comparing self with others who are thought to be "better off." Spend quality time offline as well. Setting a timer or a time limit on your phone's settings for social media apps can be helpful.







According to the FBI Internet Crime Report for 2022, the Crime Center received 800,944 complaints, a five percent decrease from 2022, the potential total loss grew from \$6.9 billion in 2022 to more than \$20.2 billion in 2022.



Hello again, MCA STAR families!

My name is Mr. Galit, and I am the VILS Coach. I am responsible for carrying out the vision and objectives of the Verizon Innovative Learning Schools (VILS) initiative.



I hope you're having a wonderful school year so

far. In this month's Coach Corner, I'd like to emphasize some basic guidelines and share a new initiative and a great new parent resource with you.

First, I would like to remind you of a few critical guidelines and expectations your child(ren) must follow.

The iPad is for educational purposes only, and usage is monitored.

Your child(ren) must bring their iPad to school fully charged daily.

While transitioning between classes, your child should carry the iPad in their backpack or the VILS bag provided by Verizon.

Second, as part of the VILS initiative, all students must complete a Digital Citizenship curriculum. Digital Citizenship assignments are being delivered this year through your child's math class. The curriculum assignments are delivered through Canvas and are due approximately every two weeks.
