Call to Order:

A meeting of the Deerfield Beach Middle School, School Advisory Council was held in ___ on 5/7/25. Chair Erika Bennett called the meeting to order at 3:34pm. Dr. Kears-Creech will record minutes for this meeting.

Minutes: Minutes from the March meeting were reviewed and accepted

Coach Cannariato gave an overview from the athletic department. Flag football boys won the championship 12-0 season. This is the first time since 1989.

Dr. Fulton gave the principal's update, March 20th was a celebration for the football team, including a parade, pep rally and banquet for players and parents.

Annual Title 1 budget School Recognition budget is 244.00, Accountability budget is 44,999.32.

18 teachers will be attending IB training. \$450.00 per teacher for a total of \$8100.

Expectations for 2024/2025: We are in Operation Go Get It, students need to be engaged. The expectations are that the students receive a level 3 or above or go up by 10 points in learning gains.

Currently 8th grade science is at 17% proficient district is at 28.22%. We have identified 44 students who we will pull out to work with beginning next week

Civics 7th graders 70.11, district 52.49%, Biology 71.83%/ District 58.63%

Algebra 1 23.62%/ District 10.89%, Geometry 23.8%/ District 15.93%

We have done several IReady challenges, we expect students to do 5 lessons and score at least 80% for both reading and math. In addition, they must complete 2 teacher led lessons.

Students have been to sky zone, a dance, and they will go to the movies, then boomers (if IReady goals are met).

We have a 41% threshold to meet with the ESE students.

The customer survey for parents, teachers, and students is now in progress. There is a certain percentage which must be met.

Next week we begin the learning gains push for the lowest quartile.
