Attendance Basics


- School begins at 7:40
- Students are considered on time when they are in assigned seat by the bell
- Students who arrive after 7:50 accompanied by a parent will be issued a pass and sent to class
- Students who arrive after 7:50 not accompanied by a parent will receive an unexcused pass from the office
- 8 minutes passing to get to class

BLOCK SCHEDULE

- In a block schedule, students attend 8 classes and earn 7 credits per year for classes passed. No credit is given for study hall.
- Classes meet for an hour and a half.

 The grades entered onto the permanent record, called a transcript, are earned at the end of each semester.

2 Quarters + Exam = One Semester

Performing or Practical Art - 1 Credit

- PE 0.5 credit in Personal Fitness AND 0.5 credit in PE, or 1.0 credit of HOPE, or Complete 2 full years of JROTC, or 2 full seasons of a Varsity or Jr. Varsity Sport
- Take an online course through www.FLVS.net
- Electives 8 credits
- Total Credits: Minimum of 24

ADDITIONAL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Level 3 or higher on the Reading Assessment

Level 3 or higher on the Algebra I EOC

- 40 Hours of Community Service
- At least a 2.0 Unweighted GPA

WORLD LANGUAGE

Not required for High School graduation

• Two credits are required for admission into a 4-year university and to qualify for the Bright Futures Scholarships.

GPA PURPOSE

- Graduation from High School (2.0)
- Class Ranking
- Earn College Admission
- Earn Scholarships
- Play on a Sports Team for school (2.0)

HOW IS A GPA EARNED?

- GPA is cumulative and is the average of <u>ALL</u> classes from 9th through 12th grade
- GPA is calculated at the end of every semester.
 - 2 Quarters + an Exam = 1 Semester
- A ½ credit is earned at the end of a semester if student passes the class
- Credit is earned at the end of the year for courses with an End Of Course Exam

COMMUNITY SERVICE HOURS

- ALL students <u>MUST</u> have their outside community service organization <u>pre-approved</u>
- Volunteer hours completed after graduating from the 8th grade will be accepted.
- Must be done at a NOT FOR PROFIT organization and students cannot be paid
- Pre-approval forms and log sheets are located on the Monarch High School website

TIPS TO SUCCEED

Ninth grade is one of the most important years of high school and requires <u>ALOT</u> of monitoring.

Now is not the time to let go!

ATTENDANCE AND TARDIES

- Bring your child to school on time
- They should be in their seat at 7:40AM!!!

They have 8 mins in between each class

SUPPLIES & ORGANIZATION

Make sure your child has their supplies for each class

- Help them to stay <u>Organized</u>
- Check backpacks and notebooks periodically

CELL PHONES & ELECTRONIC DEVICES

- Teach your child to put cellphones <u>away</u> during class time.
- Headphone, earbuds and earpods should be kept at home.

HOMEWORK & STUDYING

- Students should take Good Notes and <u>STUDY</u> them each night!
- Homework includes STUDYING!
 Prevent cramming the night before for tests and quizzes!

USE OF AGENDAS

 Instruct your child to copy assignments in their <u>AGENDA</u> daily. Homework is posted on the board.

 Check their agenda daily to make sure that they are keeping track of assignments!

CHECK PINNACLE

- Check <u>Pinnacle & Canvas</u> weekly to make sure your child is turning in <u>ALL</u> HW and Classwork Assignments on time!!!
- By checking Pinnacle often, you can catch zeros and missing assignments before it is too late.
- Don't wait until the end of the quarter!

REPORT CARDS & INTERIMS

- Print the Broward School calendar each year to stay aware of when report cards and interim reports are issued.
- Report cards and interim reports are sent home with your child.
- Know the dates so you can ask them for it.
