Welcome to the 2021-2022 school year. We're Back in the Game!!



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

The Title I, Migrant & Special Programs Department is honored to celebrate the two Broward County nominees for the 2021 Florida Migrant Education Program Exemplary Awards, *Mrs. Cecilia Pacheco, 2021 Exemplary Migrant Staff Member* and *Dr. Dennisse Melendez, 2021 Exemplary Migrant Teacher/Educator.*

Cecilia Pacheco is a highly motivated, passionate worker who applies her educational background towards delivering excellent service to migrant families and stude nts within the community. She has served as a district Migrant Education Program Identifier/Recruiter for six years. She serves our migrant children and families with passion, is trustworthy, and works collaboratively to ensure exemplary services. Mrs. Pacheco's dedication, especially during the COVID Pandemic, contributes significantly to the lives of the families we serve. The migrant students and their families are better served because of Mrs. Pacheco's perseverance.

Dr. Dennisse Melendez Garcia is an Educator whose passion is to help others succeed, especially the migrant population and people in need. Dr. Melendez is certified as a Preschool Teacher and has been in the Title I Migrant Program for four years. She first started as the Migrant classroom assistant where

she earned the trust and confidence of the parents served in our Migrant Pre-K classroom. With the extensive knowledge and experience she came with from Puerto Rico, she immediately received a Florida Teaching Certificate becoming the Migrant Pre-K Teacher soon after.

At Markham Elementary School, Dr. Melendez has implemented a program that utilizes music and cultural traditions of migrant families to teach early learners about literacy and mathematics. She writes songs in Spanish and plays songs in Creole for Haitian students to ensure all students feel safe and comfortable in her classroom. She provides pathways for students to learn new skills. She recognizes the need for academic success never losing sight of her student's social emotional needs.

Dr. Melendez is an especially active member in her church community where she plays an integral role in supporting migrant children. There, she develops diverse strategies to help young children in their educational journey. Her undying passion for serving the migrant community is exemplary.


First Baptist Church Piney Grove One Stop Shop Back 2 School Drive Through


