Title I VPK Lending Library

Mrs. Mary Yong of Welleby Elementary, one of the 50 Title I VPK teachers, has been in partnership with our early childhood initiative for the last three years, and she supports this initiative by encouraging parents and families to take part in the "Lending Library."

The Lending Library allows parents to borrow two resources/academic games for two weeks at a time to extend their child's learning at home. Mrs. Yong shared a document of the offered resources and she also provides parents with suggestions on the the types of resources/academic skills that their child can use additional support in. Parents have shared that their children have benefitted from the resources and that their children have really enjoyed the at home learning activities from the Lending Library.

Title I and the VPK Community Liaison, Mrs. Theresa Taylor, is pleased that parents and families have an opportunity to take part in their child's learning and that students develop a love of learning.

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Dad's Chat - Man in the Mirror

The second Dad's Chat of the year was held on March 2, 2021. The focus of the chat was centered around The Art of Self Reflection. There was a motivating message brought to us by the singer, song writer and producer Montell Jordan. Mr. Jordan spoke directly to the parents of the district laying out a three-layer approach to parenting. The first layer is **CONFIRMATION**. He stated that children often look to their parents for confirmation. Children often receive affirmation from other adults and friends in areas such as success and independence, but it does all come together until it is confirmed by their parents. Secondly, he felt that children look to their parents to solidify their **IDENTITY**. This gives them a solid foundation and a feeling of self-worth. Lastly, children look to their parents for their JINHERITANCE. This is not necessarily monetary but more culturally and common family beliefs. Mr. Jordan was very personable and gave some of the personal experiences he had with his own children.

Our second speaker, Mr. Guy Wheeler, who is a licensed counselor, addressed the audience by expounding on the Art of self-reflection. After a brief introduction and an explanation of the breakout activity, the participants were then taken to breakout rooms where everyone was asked to answer a specific question: "If you could talk to your younger self, what advice would you give?" There was a variety of responses to the question, but it gave us a chance to just reflect on our past experiences and what we could have done differently if we knew then what we know now.


