## Happy December from 1st Grade

Welcome to December! In first grade we are hard at work getting ready for our STEM night displays researching animals that live in the ocean and learning how they survive. Students are getting excited to share all of their new knowledge with the community on December 17th. The first graders are becoming experts at looking for similarities and differences between topics in reading. We will be discussing the holidays around the world too! The first grade team is wishing all of our families a great winter break and will be ready for the second half of the year in January!





## Winter Greetings From 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade

Second grade is getting ready for an exciting month!! During the month of December, we will be working very hard on our STEM projects on weather and life cycles of plants and animals. In language arts will be comparing and contrasting similar stories from cultures and poetry. We will also be learning how to write informational texts. In the area of social studies, we will be learning about immigrants. Addition and subtraction with carrying and borrowing will be the area of focus for Mathematics.













## Holiday Happenings in 3<sup>rd</sup> Grade!

In the month of December, 3rd grade will be continuing our literature unit. Students will be expected to describe characters, settings, and major events in literature by using key details from the text. The students will be displaying their comprehension skills as they summarize the key detail in literature. In Math, we will continue to learn the multiplication facts and introduce the concept of division; as well as the relationship between both mathematical operations. We will be practicing these facts in a variety of ways, such as games, technology, and centers. In Science we have been learning about five forms of energy; Mechanical, Electrical, Light, Thermal/Heat, and Sound. As we approach STEM night each class has chosen a form of energy to closely investigate, observe, and explain in detail. We are hard at work creating projects to display how much has been learned about these science concepts/standards.

### 5th Grade Festive Fun!

5<sup>th</sup> Grade had an amazing time at JA Biztown!! Our fabulous 5th Grade students made all of their businesses successful. We are working diligently on our S.T.E.M. projects! In Math the students are working with decimals and they are coming up with a plan to create emergency kits for 300 people without going over \$15,000. In ELA, the students are writing about hurricane survival and preparations. In Science class the students are learning about the hurricane categories and creating a structure to withstand hurricane force winds. We are so excited to present them to the school on December 19, 2019!



## 4<sup>th</sup> Grade Winter Wonderland

Fourth grade continues to strive for excellence with many exciting activities and projects upon us. In reading, we are working on referring to details and examples in a text when explaining what the text says explicitly and when drawing inferences. We are also improving our craft as writers with text based Informative Writing, based on the FSA Writing Rubrics. These rubrics clearly state the goal, and the teachers' modeled and guided instruction help the students to write a multi-paragraph essay. We are focusing on three specific areas: Focus, Organization, and Purpose, Supporting Evidence, Examples, Explanations, and finally, Mechanics and Conventions, which include appropriate word choice, proper spelling, capitalization, and punctuation. In math, we are working on dividing up to 4-digit by 1digit numbers using models and place value, with emphasis on the relationship between multiplication and division. Students are

working on memorizing their basic multiplication and division facts for accurate computation. This month our Science STEM night brings many exciting projects, as we work on Space Exploration and Technology, and the relationships of the Sun, Earth, and Moon. Please join us on December 19th from 6-7 for our museum night showcase! We are also excited for our upcoming Legoland trip, which will take place on January 31, 2020.
