

Everybody likes to know where I went to school. So for all the Gator fans out there, I am a proud member of the Gator nation!



Grade Level Updates

Kindergarten Sneak Peek

November highlights include a learning focus on comparing people from past and present while recognizing holidays and traditions. Skills will include retelling using main idea and detail, addition/subtraction, and recognizing patterns of day and night. We will be hard at work on using what we learn in order to apply the skills for our S.T.E.M. night projects. Kindergarten will also hold their annual Thanksgiving Feast in their classrooms. Please be on the lookout for information about this event.

Happy November from 1st Grade!

We have begun our Science Unit on Survival of Living Things. We have a field trip to Fern Forest to help us use our new learning to search for living and nonliving things. We are also working hard understanding how to think about the stories we are reading. We are going on a field trip to the Broward Center for Performing Arts to see the two characters of Elephant and Piggie on stage. In first grade we are excited to see learning in action this month.

Falling into 2nd Grade

November is a busy month for second graders. We are engaged in reading nonfiction books and learning how to use all the text features to enhance comprehension. We are reading books on Native Americans for Social Studies and weather for Science. Students are busy with science experiments and learning about the engineering design process. Many second graders have become gardeners and are eagerly waiting on seeds and plants to grow while learning about the lifecycle of the plants. In math, we are working on addition and subtraction facts to 20. Help us practice at home by using flash cards. We all are very thankful for friends, families, and this great school year.







Check Out What's Happening in 3rd Grade!

In the month of November, we will be starting a literature unit that includes fables, folktales, and myths from diverse cultures. The students will be recounting stories in order to determine the message, moral, or lesson. In Math, learning the multiplication facts through twelve will be the prime focus. We will be practicing these facts in a variety of ways, such as games, technology, and centers. Forms of energy will continue in Science. We will be learning mostly about light and the way in travels until it hits an object. Our third graders are learning plenty in the beginning of the second quarter.

5th Grade Fun!

5th grade is getting ready for our exciting field trip to JA World.

Reading - Scientific and

Math - Adding and subtracting decimals
Science - Weather Patterns

We are also getting ready for our first STEM Night!



4th Grade Happenings

Fourth grade has been busy working and learning and can hardly believe how fast the first quarter has gone. In reading we are working on comprehending texts using reading comprehension strategies and identifying text-based evidence to support answers to multiple choice and short response questions. We are currently focusing on identifying key ideas and details in informational texts with an emphasis on historical, scientific, and technical texts. In writing we are working on analyzing prompts, identifying text-based evidence to help answer the prompt, creating planning sheets, and using that information to write four paragraph essays. This is a new process for our students so we are doing a lot of modeled and guided instruction. In math we are working on multiplying 2-digit by 2digit numbers using partial products or the regrouping methods. We are excited for our upcoming Legoland trip which will take place on January 31, 2020. More information about this trip will be coming home with the students very soon!
