 Harvard University considers this next Hispanic in STEM as the next Albert Einstein. Sabrina Gonzalez Pasterski is a 24 year old physicist who has a very impressive resume that rivals any experienced physicist of our time. Currently Ms. Pasterski studies black holes and spacetime to explain gravity within the context of quantum mechanics. She has also been cited by Stephen Hawking and Andrew Strominger.

<u>Antonio A. Mignucci</u> - is an expert scientist specializing in the endangered tropical marine mammals and who founded the non-profit conservation organization Caribbean Stranding Network. He has dedicated his career in caring for injured or stranded sea creatures especially the West Indian Manatee. He is currently the director of the Puerto Rico Manatee Conservation Center.
