ELA Department

“Before” strategies activate students' prior knowledge, and set a purpose for reading. “During” strategies help students make connections, monitor their understanding, generate questions, and stay focused. “After” strategies provide students an opportunity to summarize, question, reflect, discuss, and respond to text.

Possible Before Reading Questions

- Do you think this is a fiction or nonfiction text? Why?
- Based on the title or book cover, what problems do you think the main characters might face? What are some possible solutions?
- What clues has the author provided for you in the title and illustrations?
- What are you wondering about?

Possible During Reading Questions

- Is there anything that you don't understand that we should go back and reread?
- What illustration do you think will be on the next page? Why?
- What details have been important to the story so far?
- How do you think this text will end? Why?

Possible After Reading Questions

- What do you think the author wanted you to learn from this text?
- If the author wrote a sequel to this text, what do you think the sequel would be about?
- Summarize this text in 2-4 sentences.
- Is there anything from the text that didn't make sense to you?
- What would you have done differently from the main character?

All Things Math

Now that Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (F.A.S.T) PM2 is completed, teachers and Instructional Coaches have analyzed our students' data and identified targeted areas for support. We are using standards-based resources that target and address our students' specific needs. We are all working diligently to make sure our students are adequately prepared for the Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (F.A.S.T.) PM3 in May 2025. Your child can visit the following online sites every day at home to receive additional practice, sharpen their Math skills, and become familiar with FAST question types:

 - o Students can access this program through Single Sign-on (SSO) on the Clever Dashboard
 - o Students can work on their prescribed Learning Path and teacher-assigned lessons
 - o The goal is for every child to reach 50+ minutes each week

 - o Scroll down and click on “Students”
 - o Click on Assessments
 - o Click on Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) Assessments
 - o Under “FAST Assessment Resources, click “Florida Statewide Assessment Portal”
 - o Click on “Florida Statewide Assessment Students & Families”
 - o Click on “View Sample Items for VPK-2” or “View Sample Items for Grades 3-10”
 - o Click “Sign-in”
 - o Select Your Child's Grade
 - o Click “Sample Items”
 - o Choose Math (Reading & Writing are also available)
 - o Click “Select”
 - o Click “Begin Test Now”
 - o The green arrow in the upper lefthand corner of the screen is used to move to the next page. Your child should spend at least 15-20 minutes every night on these sites. Completing math activities on these programs will result in significant improvement in their performance and success on Topic Assessments, Cumulative Assessments, and ultimately the F.A.S.T. Math PM3 at the end of the school year.

Meal Charge Policy

Students are expected to pay for their meal at the time of service. Broward County Public Schools encourages families to complete a meal benefits application to determine eligibility for free and reduced-price meals. **All students must pay the full price for lunch** unless designated through the Meal Benefits office to be eligible for free or reduced-price meals.

Parents must re-apply each year for their child(ren). If you have not applied to the program this year and/or have been changed back to FULL PAY - \$2 PER LUNCH -- then your student is accruing a debt for lunch meals taken.

It is a relaxed, roundtable discussion where we share coffee with parents and engage in dynamic conversations about topics of interest or address any question they may have.



ESOL FAMILY ENGAGEMENT NIGHTS – GAME NIGHTS
