How Can You Help Prepare Your Child?

- •Read more non-fiction books with your child.
- •Look at the illustrations, read captions, and predict what the book is about.
- •Start a conversation with your child about the book you are reading.
- •Tell me which illustrations helped you understand
- •What words did the author use to help you understand the text?
- •What did you learn from the illustrations?
- •What do you think the author is trying to teach you?
- Read, read, read!!!

- •One to one correspondence up to 20
- Positional words (above, below, left, right)
- Counting to 100 by ones and tens
- Correct number formation to 20
- •Number recognition to 20
- Measurement
- •2-D and 3-D shapes
- Sorting by attributes






