# Everglades I-Zone Parent Meeting

## FAST Presentation

- Florida Assessment of Student Thinking, or **FAST**, refers to the new Coordinated Screening and Progress Monitoring (CSPM) System assessments, which are **aligned to the Benchmarks in Excellent Student Thinking (B.E.S.T.) Standards**
- FAST assessments include **VPK through grade 10 English Language Arts (ELA)** and **VPK through grade 8 Mathematics**
- **Renaissance Learning** STAR Early Literacy, Reading and Math will administer grades VPK-2
- **Cambium Assessment, Inc. (CAI)** will administer grades 3-10 FAST
- End-of-Course (EOC) assessments are **not part** of FAST
- Science and Social Studies assessments are **not part** of FAST



Per s. 1008.25(8), F.S., FAST assessments will be **administered three times per year** with the first Progress Monitoring assessment (PM1) within the **first 30 days** of school.

- Test security **MUST** be maintained during all 3 PMs
- The three windows for 2022–23 school year are as follows:
  - **PM1:** September 6–23 (Recommended District Window)  
Make-Ups through September 28
  - **PM2:** December 5-16 (Recommended District Window)  
Make-Ups through January 27
  - **PM3\*:** May 1-19 (Recommended District Window)  
Make-Ups through June 2

\*Results for FAST ELA and Mathematics **MUST** be available no later than May 31 each year beginning with the **2023–2024 school year**.



# FAST: VPK-2 Star Assessments via Renaissance

\* The district office will turn on audio for all students for **Star Math**, regardless of IEP/504 status.

\*\* For PM1 of K:

- All students will participate in **Star Early Literacy**.
- For students **who score at or above 852**, the school may choose to begin assessing those students on **Star Reading on subsequent administrations**, beginning with PM2 of K.



### FAST: VPK–Grade 2 Administration

- Each test will be administered in **one session**.
- It is recommended that each student take only **one subject test in a day**
- Tests will be **computer-adaptive**, administered through a secure web browser (**headphones required**)

*\* In accordance with F.S.1008.25 (K-10) and F.S.1002.68 (VPK ), student results will be provided to parents in an expedited manner.*



# FAST 3-10 Testing Times

- The times BELOW indicate the **maximum** amount of time that should be provided for students
- For scheduling purposes, a recommended session length is provided, but **students who are still working at the end of that time should be provided with the maximum allowable** time as indicated in the table.
- For PM3, students must be provided with the total time indicated in the table.

Grades/Subject	PM 1 and PM 2	PM3*
Grades 3–10 ELA Reading	Up to 90 Minutes	120 Minutes
Grades 3–5 Mathematics	Up to 80 Minutes	100 Minutes
Grades 6–8 Mathematics	Up to 100 Minutes	120 Minutes

\*The PM3 administration is slightly longer than PM1 and PM2 because the assessments contain embedded field test items.



### FAST: Grades 3–10 Content

- Because all FAST assessments are **computer-adaptive**, items may become **progressively harder as students successfully respond** to items, and **easier if students answer more questions incorrectly**
- Each PM event is tied to a blueprint for the **full grade-level content**
- Many of the same computer-based **item types that students are already familiar** with will be used on FAST assessments

*\* In accordance with F.S. 1008.25 (K-10), student results will be provided to parents in an expedited manner.*



### FAST: Grades 3–10 Content

- **PM1 and PM2** will be used for **informational purposes** only and will not be used for accountability.
- **PM3** will be a summative assessment used for **accountability purposes**.
- There will be **paper-based** accommodations for FAST assessments in grades 3–10 for **Spring 2023** (not available for PM1 and PM2).
- **School year 2022–2023 is a baseline year**; 2023–24 and beyond with new cut scores applied.
- In late summer/early fall 2023, the state will conduct **Standard Setting** to recommend achievement level cut scores.
- Following Standard Setting, FAST scores beginning with the **2023–2024 school year will be based on the FAST scale**.






# FAST Writing Field Test

- In 2022–23, Writing will be administered as a **field test** to a representative sample of Florida students during the **Spring 2023 administration**
- Writing will be **reported separately** from Reading and will not contribute to an overall ELA score
- FAST Writing will be **computer-based** in **all assessed grades** (4-10), and prompts will be in response to text




# Important Concepts for FAST PM1 Grades 3-10



1. Teach before you reteach.

- Each progress monitoring test **covers all content expectations for that subject and grade level are assessed.**
- For PM 1, students may not yet be at grade level; however, this does not necessarily indicate that a student is not on track to succeed.
- These results should not be considered student achievement designations.



## PM1 and PM2 Scores

It is important to understand that score information is intended to provide baseline and mid-year results for PM1 and PM2 respectively. These results are for informational purposes only and should be used to identify areas that may need additional instruction and support. These results should not be considered student achievement designations.

## PM3 Scores

PM3 provides a summative score at the end of the year to measure student mastery of the grade-level content standards. The PM3 student report will show a student's performance for all three windows for comparison, if the student participated in each PM opportunity.

After the close of each PM window, the FDOE will report percentile ranks at the student level for parents, schools, and districts, as well as comparisons at the school, district, and state level.



## Scale Scores and Achievement Levels


### Scale Scores

- For the 2022–2023 school year, FAST ELA Reading and Mathematics provisional Scale Scores and achievement levels will be linked to the 2021-2022 score scale.
- **Standard setting** will begin in Summer 2023 to establish a new FAST scale.

### Achievement Levels

- The scales on which students receive scores differ by grade and subject. Achievement levels describe a student's success with the content assessed.
- As required by state law, achievement levels range from 1 to 5, with Level 1 as the lowest and Level 5 as the highest. For all assessments, Level 3 indicates on-grade-level performance





**Level 5 Mastery:** Students who score in Level 5 demonstrate mastery of the B.E.S.T. Standards for their grade. They are highly likely to excel in the next grade.

**Level 4 Proficient:** Students who score in Level 4 demonstrate proficiency in the B.E.S.T. Standards for their grade. They are likely to excel in the next grade.

**Level 3 On-Grade-Level:** Students who score in Level 3 demonstrate on-grade-level mastery of the B.E.S.T. Standards for their grade. They may need additional support to excel in the next grade.

**Level 2 Below Satisfactory:** Students who score in Level 2 demonstrate a below satisfactory level of mastery of the B.E.S.T. Standards for their grade. To be prepared for the next grade, they are likely to need substantial support.

**Level 1 Inadequate:** Students who score in Level 1 demonstrate an inadequate level of mastery of the B.E.S.T. Standards for their grade. To be prepared for the next grade, they are highly likely to need substantial support.

**Please note, for the 2022-2023 school year only, student achievement levels are provisional, and are linked to the 2021-2022 reporting scale, and required by Florida law. For 2023-2024 and beyond, scores will be reported on a new scale after the State Board of Education adopts new student achievement expectations in fall of 2023.**

Percentile rank will be reported after the PM window closes. This rank will indicate where your student's performance falls compared to all other students who took the same test in this window.


