

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Safety and Security Procedures

My goal for this school year is to provide a safe and secure environment for Plantation High School. We will continue the procedures listed below:

- All staff and students are always required to wear their ID badges
- All parents, visitors, and guests are required to provide photo identification at the front entrance and proceed to the Welcome Center to use the Security Tracking and Response (STAR) System
- The East parking lot (Sunrise Blvd and 16th St) will open at 6:45 am and close at 7:15 am each morning and close at 3:00 pm each afternoon
- Students should be dropped off at the parent loop on 70th Ave starting at 7:00 am (no student should be dropped off in the front of the school)
- The student parking on 70th will open at 7:00 am and close at 8:00 am
- Students should be picked up no later than
 3:15 pm due to adult supervision ending at that time
- The Welcome Center office hours are from 7am – 3pm

Plantation High School continues to use the "SEE SOMETHING SAY SOMETHING" initiative which encourages individuals to help protect our campus through awareness. Parents and students are also encouraged to use the Fortified FL and Safer Watch apps to report suspicious behavior.

School Counseling Services

Schedule distribution

Freshman who attend Colonel Boot Camp will receive their schedules that day. All other students will receive their schedules on the first day of school. Support staff will be in the hallways directing students to their first period classes, where they will receive their schedules.

Schedule Changes

Schedule changes will be made for the following reasons:

- Student was misplaced due to lack of prerequisite or background.
- o Student earned credit over the summer.
- Senior is not scheduled in a class for graduation.
- o Conflict in the master schedule that required a schedule change.

Teachers cannot be selected – All teachers will ensure the success of each student.

Students can pick up a schedule change request form in Guidance during lunch.

Parents/Guardians

Parents may make appointments with the counselor throughout the school day. Please contact the Guidance Desk at 754-322-1870 to schedule an appointment with the counselor.

Parent/Teacher Conferences

Conferences take place in Guidance starting at 7:15 am. Please call the Guidance Desk to schedule an appointment. Parents are encouraged to first communicate with teachers through Pinnacle or our website's school staff directory before scheduling.

Students

Students may see their counselor throughout the day by obtaining an appointment pass at the Guidance Desk. Appointment passes may be obtained during lunch and after school.

Students may walk-in without an appointment during their assigned lunch if they have a quick question that needs answering.

Attendance

Excused Absences

The parent must report the reason for the absence to the school on the day prior, the day of, or within two school days following the absence.

Absences may be excused for the following:

- Illness of student. If a doctor states in writing that the student will be absent for fifteen or more consecutive days, the guidance department should be notified so that homebound instruction can be arranged.
- o Illness of an immediate family member.
- Death in family.
- Subpoena by a law enforcement agency.
- Special events if the student gets permission from the school at least five days ahead of time. Such trips refer to exceptional cases of family need, college visitations or trips of an academic nature.
- Doctor or dental appointment if the student provides a note from the doctor or dentist giving the date and appointment time.

Note: Field trips or school-sponsored activities on or off school grounds shall count as school attendance. Internal Suspension shall count as school attendance.

Absences may be called in at any time. An answering machine is available to parents after school hours. The phone number is (754) 322-1852.

Tardiness

Students must be in class at 7:40 am or will be marked as an unexcused tardy. After the third unexcused tardy the student will receive an after-school detention. For students who are tardy to school and have a valid reason (illness, illness of an immediate family member, death in the family, required court appearance, schedule doctor or dentist appointment, etc./refer to p. 10 of the Code of Student Conduct), parents should escort students to the Welcome Center for it to be excused. Only three excused tardies are permitted.

Student Sign Out

If it is necessary to pick up a student during the school day, a parent or authorized release designee must personally appear in the office to sign out the student in the Welcome Center. A valid ID must be presented before the student is released.

Student Identification Badges

- o All Students must display school-issued ID badges above the waist.
- ID badges must be displayed throughout the entire school day.
- Students are not permitted to de-face the school-issued ID badges.

Students who need to replace their ID badge will be given the opportunity to have one made at a replacement cost of \$5.00

REPEATED OFFENSES to these procedures are subject to the progressive consequences listed in the Discipline Matrix.

Textbooks

Students are responsible for obtaining textbooks during the first week of classes. The textbook room is in 138D, behind the Media Center. Ms. Butterfield is the textbook coordinator.

Study Hall Period

All students are scheduled in a required 90-minute study hall period. Students can utilize the study hall period to study for tests, complete homework, meet with their school counselors, speak with teachers if they are available, and other school related matters. Students must be in attendance during study hall.

Food Deliveries

No food deliveries are permitted during school hours. Outside vendors, such as Uber Eats, Grub Hub, PostMates, etc., will be turned away and students will not be notified.

Back to School Paperwork

Parents/Guardians can now fill out back-to-school emergency contact & code of student contact forms online. The forms are easy to complete, and all data is protected and secure. For families with multiple children attending Broward County Public Schools, some information will only need to be entered once. Use the Back to School Wizard to quickly complete the process. You will need your student's 06 identification number. Forms can be filled out in English, Spanish, Haitian-Creole and Portuguese. Please complete these forms at the start of the school year for your child. It will take approximately 20 minutes. Once you complete and submit the forms, you will receive an email confirmation. Print and return the confirmation to Plantation High School by Friday, August 23.
