**Safety Check: Opening Outside Doors** 

### Q: Why shouldn't students open the doors?

A: Students should not open the outside doors for any reason to make sure we maintain a safe learning environment.

# Q: What should students do if someone asks them to open the door?

A: Students should direct the person to come in through the front office/single point entry.

### Q: What if the person persists?

A: Tell a teacher, administrator or staff member and they will take care of the situation.

### Silver Lakes Middle School Safe Plan

To ensure the safety of all students and staff at Silver Lakes Middle, we all need to adhere to the school's SAFE plan.

- 1. ID badges will be worn by students, staff and visitors at all times.
- The bus loop will now be located in the front of the school. Car riders will be dropped off on the WEST side of the school.
- 3. Students may be dropped off to school/breakfast between 8:30 and 9:10am in the west side car loop.
- 4. Students **MUST** be picked up by 4:15pm daily.
- 5. The perimeter gates will be secured from 9:30am to 2:30pm daily. Please call 754-322-4601 to gain access and have your government ID ready for verification.
- 6. When any gate is open, a car rider ID tag or government ID are required to access to the school.
- 7. All visitors must check in at the main office/single point entry.
