


Parents we will continue to build healthy partnerships, so your child can reach their highest potential. Let's stay connected by:

Physical Education Corner

Last month in Physical Education students in grades 2-5, learned how to dribble the basketball. First they explored how the ball works, and learned that the harder a basketball is bounced the higher the ball goes. The softer we bounce a basketball, the lower the ball goes. The objective was to find a medium balance because all great dribblers keep the ball at their waistline. We started with two hands to gain rhythm and confidence then moved into one hand and then gained mobility. Overall students did a great job grasping the new concepts.

For our Kindergarten and First grade students, they learned how to follow directions while using their motor skills. We started with a basic down and back race with simple directions such as touch the line and touch the cone. Each time we met, I added another element which could be a jump in between or a new direction wihile using motor skills. The goal for students was to complete an obstacle course while following basic instructions and using their motor skills.
