

Policies

Attendance:

According to Attendance Policy 5.5, an absence needs to be excused by parent/guardian within a 48 hour period of time for every student absence. Five excused/unexcused absences/tardies during a marking period are considered a "pattern of non-attendance" and a referral from the teacher will be administered.

Signing Out:
Students are not allowed to sign out during the last 30 minutes of the school day.

Suspensions:

SB Policy 5006 outlines all the violations that result in out-of-school suspension and expulsion and/or the consequences. Suspended students are eligible to receive assignments and may earn credit and grades for make-up work during the suspension period. The make up work is due the day the students return from suspension.
