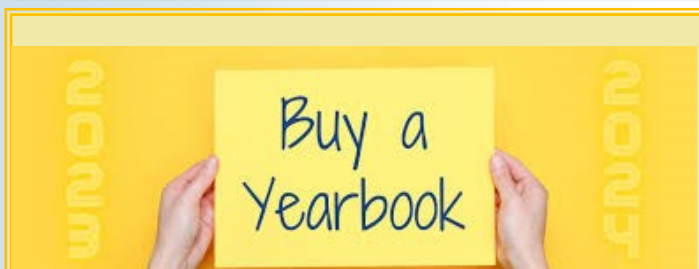

School Safety and Crisis

Preventing Youth Suicide: Tips for Parents and Educators

Suicide is preventable. Youth who are contemplating suicide frequently give warning signs. Do not be afraid to ask about suicidal thoughts. Never take warning signs lightly or promise to keep them secret.

Preventing Teen Suicide: Tips for Peers

Suicide rarely happens without warning. As a peer, you may be in the best position to recognize when a friend might need help and help them get it. You may see signs in person, hear about them secondhand, or see them online in social media. Never ignore these signs.



Risk Factors

- Hopelessness
- Nonsuicidal self-injury (e.g., cutting)
- Mental illness and substance abuse
- History of suicidal thinking and behavior
- Prior suicide among peers or family members
- Interpersonal conflict, family stress/dysfunction
- Presence of a firearm in the home



Warning Signs

- Suicidal threats in the form of direct (e.g., "I want to die") and indirect (e.g., "I wish I could go to sleep and not wake up") statements
- Suicide notes, plans, online postings
- Making final arrangements
- Preoccupation with death
- Giving away prized possessions Talking about death
- Sudden unexplained happiness Increased risk taking
- Heavy drug/alcohol use

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Monthly Emergency Drills—Required by Law

PLAIN LANGUAGE PROTOCOLS

The plain language emergency protocol will eventually eliminate the use of ALL color codes, as required by the federal government and the MSD Commission, that are currently in place in Broward County Schools. STHS will abide by the required monthly emergency drills as dictated by FL Statute 1006.07 and SBBC Policy 2120.



EMERGENCY PROTOCOL	ACTION STATEMENT	RESPONSE PROCEDURES
HOLD	"Hold in your room or area and clear the halls."	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Non-emergency situation. Business as usual. Clear the halls for emergency movement if needed.
SECURE	"Secure. Get inside. Lock outside doors."	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Danger outside the campus. No entry or exit of the building until "All clear" is given.
LOCKDOWN	"Lockdown. Locks, lights, out of sight."	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Danger inside campus/buildings. Cover windows, lights off, silence. Move into "Safer Spaces". No movement until "All clear" is given.
EVACUATE	"Evacuate. (State reason)."	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Notify Principal/designee. Minimum 300' from buildings. Await further instructions.
SHELTER	"Shelter. (State reason and location)."	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Move all persons into school buildings. Follow directions from emergency management personnel. No movement until "All clear" is given.
ALL CLEAR	"All clear."	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Followed by plain language directive.

Important Notice: Florida Statute 943.082 states that *if, following an investigation, it is determined that a person knowingly submitted a false tip through FortifyFL*, the Internet protocol (IP) address of the device on which the tip was submitted will be provided to law enforcement agencies for further investigation, and *the reporting party may be subject to criminal penalties* under s. 837.05. In all other circumstances, unless the reporting party has chosen to disclose his or her identity, the report will remain anonymous.

Photo IDs Required at STC & STHS!



All students, staff, parents, and community members must show valid PHOTO ID to enter campus. Sheridan Tech College and Technical High School require all visitors to check in through a Single Point Entry on the south side of the building. All staff and district personnel must have their School or BCPS ID Badge.

- Any students who do not have a school-issued ID must go to the Administrative Office for a new one. Progressive discipline applied on 3rd replacement ID in same school year.
- All visiting parents/guardians and community members must present a valid photo ID at the Single Point Entry.
