

Students walking from the far side of the loop, through the parking lot, and/or from the inside (left ane) of the parent loop are unsafe and unacceptable practices for student safety.



Safety Protocols for Vehicle & Student Traffic on Campus

Please honor the traffic flow and expectations for safe student, staff, and moving vehicle movement while in the parent loop on the east side of campus and surrounding areas.

There is to be NO student walking traffic in any area other than the sidewalk along the east side of the front of school. Please do not allow students to enter/exit your vehicle on the far or inside lanes of the parent loop.

Please drive all the way forward on the parent loop, along the sidewalk, as far as possible before stopping to load or unload your student on the sidewalk in front of the school.

Students walking from the far side of the loop, through the parking lot, and/ or from the inside (left lane) of the parent loop are unsafe and unacceptable practices for student safety.

ARRIVAL & DISMISSAL REMINDERS:

- Parent Loop is the only designated location for vehicle drop off/pick up; accessible via Pines Blvd and NW 209th Avenue.
- No parent traffic is allowed at Johnson Street and NW 209th Ave.
- Notice to Staff: The Johnson Gates at NW209 will close after the arrival of the last bus in the AM.
- NW 209th Ave between Johnson and NW 2nd St is owned by BCPS; it is not a
 public road.
- PLEASE carpool or take advantage of your assigned BCPS bus to reduce campus traffic.
- Students may only be on campus during designated times of adult coverage: 6:40AM-3:10PM.

CAMPUS GATES:

- All campus gates will be locked at 8AM.
- Visitors must park in the east lot; check in through the Single Point Entry with a valid Photo ID in the main office.
- Student drivers have the option to move their vehicles from the South Student Lot to the Staff lots on the east and north sides, closest to the athletic fields after 2:40PM.
- Student drivers MUST move their vehicles from the east side of the student lot before 4PM.
- NO PARKING by any person is permitted behind Building 5, next to the soft-ball/baseball fields in any of the grass areas.

Photo IDs Required at WBH!



All students, staff, parents, and community members must show valid PHOTO ID to enter campus. West Broward High utilizes a Single Point Entry through the main entry gates on the east side of the building. All staff must have their School ID.

- All visiting parents/guardians and community members must present a valid photo ID at the Single Point Entry to the camera (left of the entry doors) and wait to be buzzed in by the Raptor ID System.
- All students new to WBH may use their previous school's ID.
- Any students who do not have a school-issued ID will receive one from WBH during their personalization hour within the first two weeks of school.
- Picture Days are scheduled for September 8 and September 9.
 A replacement ID may be taken in the media center; an obligation for each ID after the 5th replacement will be \$5 each.

Dress Code Policy—Code Book for Student Conduct

- Footwear must be worn at all times. Parents should ensure that the shoes worn by their children do not impede their safety while at school. For grades K-12, bedroom slippers are not allowed. Students in grades K-8 may not wear backless, slingbacks, or open-toed footwear. Students in grades 9-12 are permitted to wear backless, sling-back, or open-toed footwear.
- 2. Special clothing, including footwear, may be required for safety reasons in certain programs or activities such as physical education, home economics, career/technical education, and science.
- 3. Revealing clothing or clothing that exposes the torso is not allowed. Examples include, but are not limited to: tank tops or spaghetti straps without overblouses (long shirts) or jackets; see-through garments; mini-skirts or mini-dresses; halters; backless dresses; jackets, shirts, or blouses tied at the midriff; and bare midriff outfits.
- 4. Clothing which is not worn appropriately, is not properly fastened, or has tears that are *indecent will not be permitted. All trousers, including oversized or low-hanging trousers, must be worn and secured at waist level.
- 5. Garments including, but not limited to, pajamas, boxer shorts, bloomers, and bustiers, which were traditionally designed as undergarments, sleepwear, or beachwear, may not be worn as outer garments. Other clothing not allowed are: leggings without overblouses (long shirts) that reach mid-thigh, tights, bodysuits, or hosiery, including those with lace trim, and bicycle racing attire unless they are worn underneath dresses, skirts, or shorts of appropriate length. Appropriate T-shirts may be worn as outer garments.
- Clothing that exposes the upper thigh is not allowed. Shorts that are not shorter than mid-thigh, including walking shorts, Bermuda shorts, and split skirts (culottes), are allowed. For Pre-K through 3, shorter shorts may be worn since these are standard attire for these ages.
- 7. Clothing, jewelry, buttons, haircuts, or other items or markings which are, *suggestive, *revealing, or *indecent, associated with gangs or cults, encourage the use of drugs, alcohol, or violence, or support discrimination on the basis of age, color, disability, ethnicity, gender, gender identity, gender expression, linguistic differences, marital status, national origin, race, religion, socioeconomic background, sexual orientation, physical appearance, or on any other basis are not allowed
- 8. Head coverings including, but not limited to, caps and hats are not allowed unless they are necessary for safety in programs such as home economics, technology education, vocational education, and athletics or are worn for religious or medical reasons. Bandannas are not allowed. Hats, that do not violate #7 above, are allowed to be worn outdoors for physical education and recess as a safety precaution from sun damage.

Note: Exceptions may be granted to head coverings at the principal's/designee's discretion based upon extenuating circumstances for a particular student.

*Indecent, suggestive, and revealing refer to exposure of private body parts and/or pictures or words with a sexual connotation.



ONLINE THREATS



<u>Florida State Statute</u>: 836.10 ~ Written or electronic threats to kill, do bodily injury, or conduct a mass shooting or an act of terrorism; punishment; exemption from liability.

- (1) As used in this section, the term "electronic record" means any record created, modified, archived, received, or distributed electronically which contains any combination of text, graphics, video, audio, or pictorial represented in digital form, but does not include a telephone call.
- (2) It is unlawful for any person to send, post, or transmit, or procure the sending, posting, or transmission of, a writing or other record, including an electronic record, in any manner in which it may be viewed by another person, when in such writing or record the person makes a threat to:(a)Kill or to do bodily harm to another person; or (b)Conduct a mass shooting or an act of terrorism.

A person who violates this subsection commits a felony of the second degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082, s. 775.083, or s. 775.084.
