Visual & Performing Arts

Cypress Bay artists dominated several prestigious art competitions:

- Scholastic Art Awards: 1 Gold Key Portfolio, 1 Silver Key, 2 Honorable Mentions, plus 22 individual work awards including 3 Gold Keys.
- Superintendent's AP Art Show: 16 student works juried into the exhibit; Mariana Perozo won Best in Show and Samantha Canini earned a Wall of Excellence spot.
- Broward All-Stars Art Show: 35 works juried in. Melic Cuevas Luy won 1st in Photography and Jackson Bissacot won 1st in Digital Art.
- NSU Teen Art Exhibition: 36 students selected for the "Un-Natural Selection" exhibit at NSU Museum, showcasing alongside iconic artists Christo and Jeanne-Claude.
- **Kamila Figuera** placed 2nd in the NSU Holocaust Reflections Art Competition.
- **Amberly Roque and Ash Guillen** received honors for their outstanding 3D artwork at the Superintendent's Art Showcase.

National Art Honor Society's Art Festival featured over 50 student artists. The event raised \$1,500 for Camillus House, blending creativity and community service.

Chorus earned straight superiors from every judge at District MPA—CBHS was the only traditional secondary school to do so.

- Latinos in Action shined at the FAU LIA Conference, earning Gold in Mastermind, top awards in visual art and writing, and Ms.
 Mariana Rodriguez Angulo was named LIA Teacher of the Year!

Athletics


- Girls Soccer finished as FHSAA 7A State Runner-Up!

Mu Alpha Theta Sets Records & Heads to State: On March 1st, Cypress Bay's Mu Alpha Theta chapter hosted the March Regional Competition, welcoming nearly 1,000 students—making it the largest regional, state, or national Mu Alpha Theta event in the past six years. The team will head to the State Convention in April, where they aim to achieve their third consecutive 1st place in the Community Service Competition.

This achievement reflects exceptional PSAT performance, academic rigor, and a consistent record of excellence throughout their high school careers.

ASSESSMENTS

April 3rd Testing Day Information

On Thursday, April 3rd, important exams will be administered: **BEST Writing** – All 9th & 10th grade students

SAT School Day – All 11th grade students (must bring a College Board-approved calculator)

Florida Civics Literacy Exam – Seniors enrolled in Government Honors or Government

All exams are digital and will be taken on school-issued devices. We will follow a modified bell schedule with no junior privilege. Students must report directly to Period 2. No early dismissals will be allowed during the testing block.Parents, April 3rd is a regular school day. Expect long lines for early sign-out, your patience is appreciated. State Testing

State testing begins soon, and it's important that all students are prepared and present on their scheduled testing days. On **May 7**, all **9th and 10th grade** students will take the **Florida FAST Reading** assessment. On **May 8**, students enrolled in **U.S. History and Biology** will take their respective End-of-Course (EOC) exams. On **May 14**, students currently enrolled in **Algebra 1 or Geometry** will take their EOC exams.

These assessments are critical for student progress and graduation requirements. More information will be shared soon, and we encourage families to review the testing calendar posted on our school website for all upcoming dates, including AP and Cambridge exams.



Mobile Duress Alert App

Alyssa's Alert is a mobile duress alert application that empowers staff members to immediately notify first responders in the event of an emergency. Receive potentially life-saving aid with the push of a button.

Speed Crisis Response

Upon activation*, local first responders & District personnel receive an immediate notification of the emergency.

Easy to Use

Select one of the three buttons (shown right) to activate Alyssa's Alert. Assistance will immediately be dispatched to your location.**

Stay Connected

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Administrators will be able to push important updates regarding an emergency situation to anyone who has downloaded Alyssa's Alert.

*Duress buttons can only be activated while physically on school property. **ONLY first responders may access location information upon button activation. Under no other circumstances is location information accessible.
