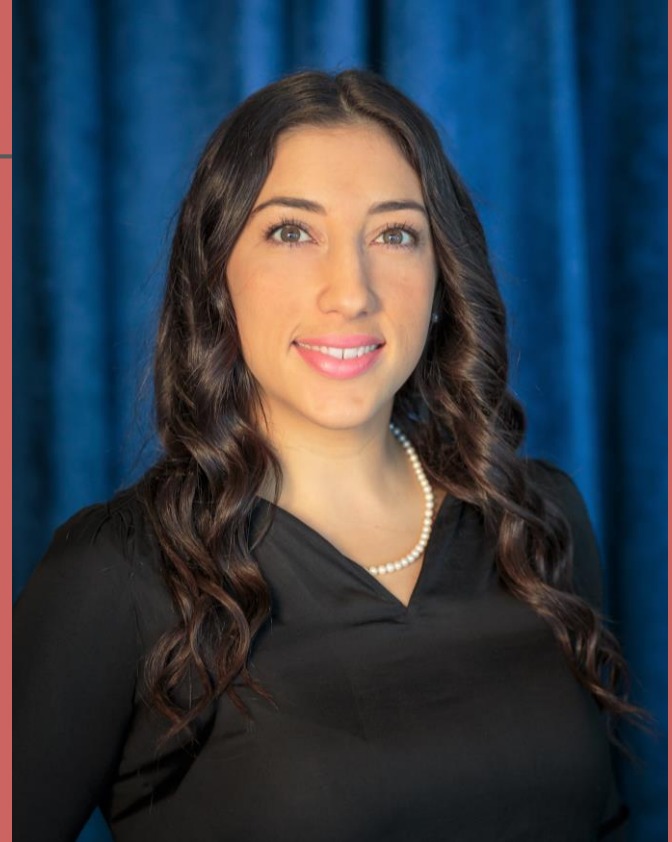

CREDIT RECOVERY

IS YOUR CHILD IS MISSING CREDITS TO GRADUATE?

We offer two options for students to recover credits:

21st Century Course Recovery

- For classes that you have previously failed.
- Starts immediately
- Mon-Thurs, 3pm-5pm, In-Person
- Classes do not count for NCAA or Bright Futures

BVS – Broward Virtual School

- Fully Online program
- Through FLVS.net
(must select “Broward Virtual”)
- Students who possibly qualify for Bright Futures must use this program.
- Student-Athletes must use this program.

COMMUNITY SERVICE HOURS

Requirements:

- Standard Diploma Graduation (all students): 40 hours
- Bright Futures Scholarship: 100 hours (FAS) or 75 hours (FMS)
- Silver Cord at Graduation: 250 hours

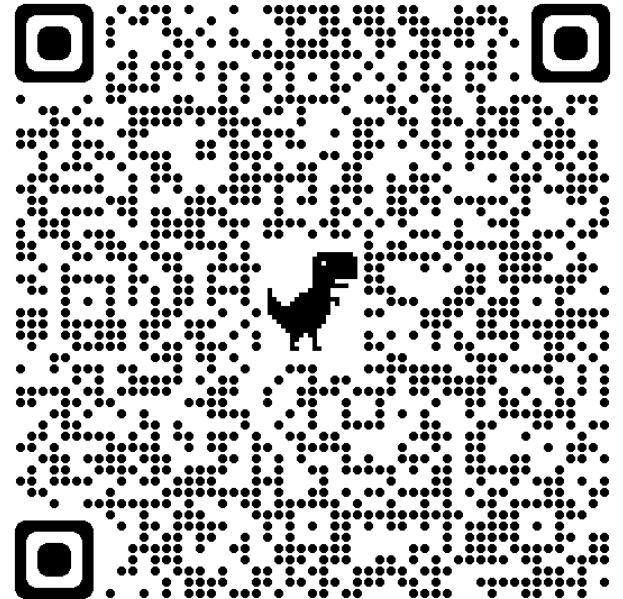

WHAT SENIORS SHOULD BE DOING NOW:

APPLY FOR SCHOLARSHIPS CONSTANTLY!



- Create your **Common App and Coalition App accounts**.
- List your school counselor's name and email address correctly so s/he will receive recommendation and transcript requests.
- **Start college applications**. DO NOT wait for a better GPA or higher SAT/ACT scores! Make sure to apply to many different types of schools! Have plenty of safe schools on your list!
- Ask teachers to write **letters of recommendation** only if needed. Provide a completed Brag Sheet to each recommender.

FINANCIAL AID

Financial Aid is all money that helps students fund their education.

Financial aid can consist of all or some of the following:

- ✓ Scholarships
- ✓ Need-based awards
- ✓ Work-study employment
- ✓ Low-interest, Federal Student loans

- ▶ Nearly 2/3 of full-time college students receive some form of need-based aid [source: NCES].
- ▶ **Need-based financial aid eligibility is based on two calculations -- the total cost of education and the family's ability to pay.** Generally, these calculations include all reasonable costs (tuition, room, board and living expenses) of attendance.

To apply for FAFSA, go to:

FAFSA APPLICATION OPENS OCT 1st

FIRST STEP: CREATE FSA ID

Go to www.fsaaid.ed.gov/ and create an FSA ID.

- **Student must have one and one parent must have their OWN FSA ID.** The parent FSA ID must be created with a *different* email address from the student's email address.
- At the end, it will send a "secure code" to your email address. You will have to go to your email, get the code and enter it into the FSA website. This is the last step in creating your FSA ID.

It's a username and password you'll need to sign the FAFSA online.

USE THE CSS PROFILE TO APPLY FOR INSTITUTIONAL AID

By filling out one form, students can apply online for non-federal financial aid from almost 300 participating colleges and scholarship programs. The form can be completed as early as October 1st of a student's senior year, and at least 2 weeks prior to a school's deadline.

There are millions of scholarship dollars available from non-college/university sources that every student should apply for! Each year, foundations, employers, religious organizations, service organizations and municipalities work hard to raise money so they can give it away as scholarships to deserving students! It's up to students and their families to aggressively search and apply for these opportunities beginning as early as possible!

WHERE TO START SEARCHING FOR SCHOLARSHIPS?

- Log into the **Scholarship List on Naviance** for a list of currently available scholarships.
- **Ask** an employer, church/temple, city or favorite retailer if they offer scholarships in your community.
- **Google search** "scholarships for high school students," and include your specific interest, talent, disability or location!

NAVIANCE

Students can **research college, scholarships, careers, enrichment programs** and courses all in one location!
They can also create individual plans that can be linked to college and career readiness.

Students will use Naviance to:

- Apply to college, search for colleges, career information and scholarships.
- Request transcripts and letters of recommendations for college applications.
- Email their School Counselor or BRACE Advisor
- Create resumes, brag sheets, career assessments & perform college and career searches.
- Learn more about careers by watching over 3,000 videos on Roadtrip Nation.
- They will also be required to complete tasks assigned by their school counselors.

BRIGHT FUTURES SCHOLARSHIP

What is Bright Futures ?

The Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program rewards lottery-funded scholarships to Florida high school graduates for high academic achievement.

- All High School students in Florida can apply.
- You must meet indicated requirements
- Students have until their graduation to meet requirements and complete application.
- Check your eligibility at *FloridaShines.org*

Application opens: October 1st and must be done before graduation day.

KICKOFF!

- Apply for Federal Financial Aid (FAFSA) - Free Application for Federal Student Aid/FAFSA Opens!! **Complete FAFSA** as early as possible to get in line for first-come, first-served money, even if you think you won't qualify for financial aid.
- Apply for Florida Scholarships and Grants (FFAA) - Florida Financial Aid Application/FFAA Opens! **Complete the FFAA** as early as possible to get in line for first-come, first-served money, even if you think you won't be eligible for any of the scholarships and grants - you never know!
- **College month:** Many college events on campus to encourage students!

NOVEMBER 1ST

- **College/University Priority Deadlines-** Be considered for all institutional scholarships without separate applications by meeting most priority application deadlines. Make sure ALL college applications are complete and have been submitted.
- **University of Florida application deadline.**
- Florida State University and **FSU CARES** Summer Bridge Program application deadlines.

DECEMBER

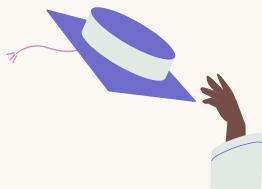
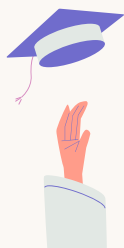
- Don't delay your **SAT/ACT registration!** Many times, December is the last set of test scores schools will consider.

MAY 1ST

- **National College Decision Day.** Four-Year Colleges give you until this date to make your decision and pay your enrollment deposit to reserve your spot.

GRADUATION
DAY, 2022

- Satisfy Bright Futures' GPA and community service hour requirements - **You must earn a qualifying GPA and required community service hours by graduation day in June.**
- June SAT/ACT scores count! You can still qualify for a Bright Futures Scholarship or even increase your award level with higher June test scores.

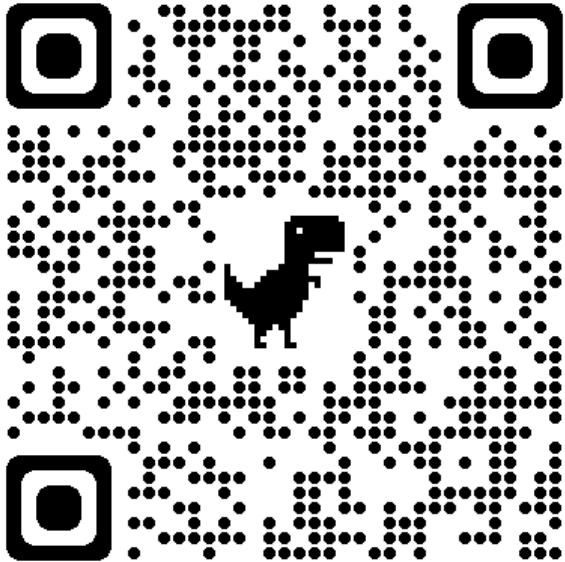
