SCHOOL MEAL BENEFITS

Power Up! With nutritious meals from your local school cafeteria.

Broward County Public Schools Food and Nutrition Services (BCPSFNS) offers FREE breakfast to all BCPS students every school day and as a part of the Community Eligibility Provision Program (CEP), all FLHS students qualify for daily free lunch as well.

Student identification badges are required to be scanned at the Point of Sale for each meal in the cafeteria.

All families are encouraged to complete the Income Survey and Meal Benefits Disclosure Form to discover additional benefits that are available to them such as tuition reductions, fee waivers for SAT/ACT/PSAT exams and college application fees.

SAFETY & SECURITY

At FLHS the safety and wellbeing of our students, staff and families is our number one priority. With this in mind, we need everyone's support; if you **SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING**. Everyone is encouraged to report suspicious or dangerous behavior, as well as any threats to our school and in an emergency, call 911 immediately. Reports can be made to any staff member on campus, however, preferably should be reported to one of the school's administrators or security staff members.

Now, any student, educator, parent, or member of the public can also report school safety concerns directly to law enforcement and school administrators anonymously and easily through FortifyFL which is a suspicious activity reporting app or one of the other tip reporting methods mentioned below:

Students, staff, and visitors **are required to wear their identification badges at all times while on school campus**. At the beginning of the year students will be required to use IDs from the previous school year until new ones are issued for the 2023-2024 school year. Dates for ID pictures will be forthcoming.

In addition, Broward County Public Schools' Emergency Management Department collaborates with district-wide stakeholders, its partners, and the community to establish a framework to prepare for, respond to, recover from, and mitigate the impact of all emergencies. Our students and staff are provided with comprehensive training and drills on all emergency policies and procedures (such as evacuations or lock-downs) based on the Emergency Preparedness Manual. CODE OF CONDUCT

The Code of Student Conduct, Policy 5.8, provides specific information regarding the rules that all students are expected to adhere to, as well as consequences for violations. Important among these rules are consistent and timely attendance, respect for people and property, appropriate dress, technology usage, student publications, student activities, student records and prohibited items such as weapons, drugs, e-cigarettes and other vapor devices. The School Board of Broward County, Florida, approves and affirms its support of the Code of Student Conduct, Policy 5.8.

FLHS ATTENDANCE & SIGN-OUT POLICIES

School Board Policy 5.5 outlines the rules that apply to attendance and attendance procedures. You may view BCPS attendance policies [here](#).

A student's presence in class is required to maximize the attainment of instructional objectives. For students who demonstrate patterns of non-attendance, interventions may be recommended.

Parents, or anyone authorized for pick-up (on emergency contact forms) **must come inside the main office with a picture ID to sign students out for early dismissal**. The school system strongly encourages parents/guardians to ensure their student is in school for the full school day every day so that their academic performance is not negatively impacted. **Also, students shall not be released within the final 30 minutes of the school day unless it is determined by administration that it is an emergency.**

FLHS DISCIPLINE PLAN

FLHS faculty, staff, and community stakeholders came together to organize our 2023-2024 Discipline Plan. Key student expectations outlined in the plan are as follows:

- Students must arrive to class on time & must adhere to all the policies set forth in each teacher's syllabus.
- Wireless communication devices must be out of sight during all instructional time.
- Students will engage in conduct that meets the goals set forth in the FLHS Positive Behavior Plan.

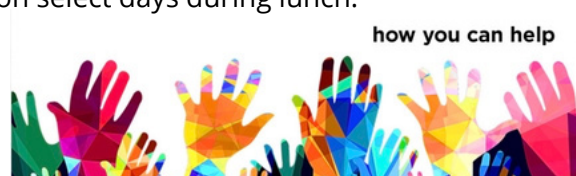

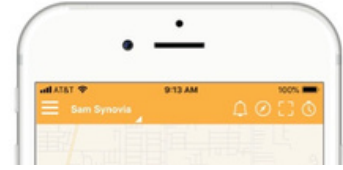
JOIN OUR PTSA

BUS & TRANSPORTATION

Get ready for the back-to-school season with these School Bus Updates & Tips for Students, Parents and Commuters:

- All students eligible for bus transportation services must **REGISTER 2 RIDE** by clicking here and following the steps provided. Students will have their bus routes posted on Virtual Counselor according to the timelines provided on the flyer.
- Expect school bus delays the first few weeks of school due to traffic congestion around campuses, schools regulating dismissals, and students becoming familiar with their bus drivers.
- Students should arrive at the bus stop at least 10 minutes early.
- The bus stop and the school bus are considered an extension of the classroom and students are expected to observe the same code of discipline expected in the school classroom.
- Parents are **encouraged to contact Transportation Services at 754-321-4400 or our Transportation Liaison, Mr. Lenard at 754-322-1118** or if they have questions or concerns regarding their child's bus route.



The BCPS Transportation Services Department is excited to introduce **Here Comes the Bus** (HCTB), a free and easy-to-use website and application that allows parents to view the location of their child's school bus in real-time on a smartphone, tablet or personal computer. Here Comes the Bus will make knowing when your child's school bus is arriving easier.

PARKING DECALS

Any student driving a vehicle on campus must complete a parking decal application, along with submitting a copy of a valid drivers license, insurance card, registration, and pay the \$52 fee. Applications can be found on our school website and decals can be purchased at: <https://www.browardschools.com/osp> on a first come first serve basis.

All students who will be driving to school will be required to park in the student lot on 16th street or in the Aquatic Center. Parking decals **MUST** be clearly displayed on rearview mirrors to avoid any consequences. Please make sure that you adhere to this rule for the 2023-2024 school year.

Seniors are now able to pay for their parking decals on the estore and pick them up at FLHS the week of August 14th - 18th. Underclassmen needing parking decals may purchase them on the website above as of August 21st and they will be distributed on campus.

STUDENT DROP-OFF

For safety reasons, we are no longer allowing students to be dropped off in the Aquatic Center or on 16th street. Students must be dropped off at the point of entry (front of the school) or in the back of the school.

ATHLETICS

Is your child interested in getting involved in sports? If so, the following requirements must be completed before any student can take part in sporting events. This includes participation in all practices and games:

- **Pre-participation Physical** - MUST be a sport related physical (Form EL2) - Yearly
- **Consent and Release from liability certificate** (Form EL3) - Yearly
- **Memorial Health Care System parental consent** for treatment - Yearly
- All incoming 9th grade students are eligible to participate until the second semester. After second semester of 9th grade, all athletes **must maintain a Grade Point Average of 2.0 or above** - Yearly
- **Affidavit of Compliance** with the policies on athletic recruiting and non-traditional student participation (Only for students from FLHS students that did NOT start with FLHS for their 9th grade year)
- **Proof of medical insurance** with student's name on the insurance card. Insurance can be purchased for school sports at www.schoolinsuranceofflorida.com - Yearly
- **Birth Certificate** might be requested.
