Kindergarten Updates

Kindergarten began and ended the third quarter with a love for reading and a focus on all the places reading and books can take us. Superkids, our language arts unit, continued to be fully implemented by all classes, as we move to Journeys online instruction in the fourth quarter. In exploring our love for reading, we also continue to work on our writing skills and our areas of interest which includes cooking, animals, sports, inventors and much more. Each new story or topic is a path to widening educational growth.

Parents, please continue to read to your child every night, practice i-Ready on a regular basis, and run-through the Dolch primer and prepremier sight words (memory words or high frequency words.) Familiarize your child with these words as it will help them become

more fluent in reading. As we continue our virtual instruction we know "Learning Never Ends," and we maintain that focus as we prepare our scholars for what's to come in first grade.

In ELA our focus will be on decoding words with short vowel sounds as we practice comprehension skills and strategies through literature. Parents you can help by asking questions which include:

Reminder...

Scholars should average 45 minutes on i-Ready reading/math and achieve a 75% or higher passing rate on a weekly basis. Details, Rhyming, Retelling, Predicting Outcomes, and Cause/Effect. Help your child by writing simple sentences, using periods, question marks, and exclamation marks. This will help prepare the scholars for returning to school in the first grade.

In math our Sea Castle family celebrated the 100th day of school at the end of January. Our youngest scholars continue to practice counting to greater numbers while making connections to addition sentences and place value. We encourage parents to continue having your child practice addition sentences and naming the place of each digit in a number.

In Science and Social Studies we continue to identify items in the daytime sky vs. the night time sky, as well as distinguishing between near and far. Please have scholars continue to identify holidays, and work on digital citizenship as we venture into this new style of learning and communicating.

First Grade Updates

First grade continues to practice all that we have learned in reading while still working to incorporate writing practice at home. We continue to target more difficult frequency words and sharpen decoding skills to help solve unfamiliar words. This effort will help deepen our scholar's reading fluency and overall comprehension.

In math, our scholars have recently completed chapters on, how to measure objects directly and indirectly, How to tell and write time, and how to represent and interpret data. Going forward for the next set of chapters, we will be learning about the concept of geometry, along with reasoning for shapes and their attributes.

In science, during the last quarter we reviewed space and the difference between living and non-living things and then completed the unit on patterns of movement. Building upon this, we are going to learn about the benefits and disadvantages of the Sun, materials on Earth's Surface, plant parts and changes to land, both fast and slow.

In Social Studies, the scholars are learning the concept of "value" as it relates to economics and the quality of life. We are including

digital citizenship in our instruction. We will also be learning about farms and what farmers do, We will include how farmers grow food for us, the journey of food from the farm to our supermarket and finally to our kitchen table.

Second Grade Updates

Second grade continues to work hard towards their goals in all subject areas.

Time spent on i-Ready for reading and math should continue to equal 45 minutes per week. This will help reinforce what scholars have learned in the past quarters for both subjects. In ELA reading poetry (rhymes, alliteration, repetition, and onomatopoeia.), story structure, and text features continue to be a focus. Scholars will remain working on these attributes as well as building fluency and comprehension as we incorporate these skills into science and social studies. Digital citizenship, moving into the fourth and final quarter of school, will also be a focus of our social studies unit. In math, scholars have learned to fluently add and subtract within 100. Scholars should continue to exercise these skills through independent practice and use strategies through distance learning and Canvas to help prepare them for the next set of standards in third grade. This is a great time to get in some extra practice with addition and subtraction including regrouping (carrying over) and begin working on memorizing multiplication facts.

At home, please continue to have students practice their reading fluency and stamina by setting aside at least 20 minutes of sustained reading each night, completing i-Ready assignments, and practicing weekly spelling and/or vocabulary words. You can access books through Clever and the Scholastic App as all materials are now open.

Third Grade Updates

Our third grade scholars are adjusting nicely to distance learning.

their vocabulary, and developing fluency. We continue this focus with an increase on comparing and contrasting two texts on the same topic, also further expanding on what stories, plays and poems are made of. We continue to build upon reading skills through the infusion of science and social studies, helping our scholars practice their reading skills through a wide range of texts and genres. In math, students are continuing to use strategies to help them determine what operation and information is needed to solve word problems. We are reviewing and practicing time, measurement, geometry, place value, fractions, multiplication/division and addition/subtraction. In addition to any assigned work on Canvas, scholars should be completing 45 minutes a week on i-Ready reading and math, each scholar has a pathway designed for them through i-Ready as well as teacher assigned lessons. Please be sure you are checking your child's Canvas daily for current assignments, announcements, and due dates. Continue to stay safe and healthy. Remember, WE WILL GET THROUGH THIS TOGETHER!!!!

Fourth Grade Updates

Our fourth grade scholars have been working very hard! Over the past few weeks, we have been giving instruction through distance learning in ELA, social studies, math and science by using the learning management system Canvas. Our scholars are also using different apps to expand their learning, for example NewsEla, Brain Pop, STEMscopes, Nearpod, Kahoot and Think Central.

In ELA we have been reviewing skills previously taught in reading, language arts and social studies. There is an emphasis on integrating information from various texts on the same topic in order to write about the subject knowledgeably. We continue to focus on how to find context clues in literal and nonfiction text. The scholars are presenting this knowledge through writing in discussion posts on the class discussion board. The discussion post allows scholars to proudly present their knowledge in a cohesive argument with evidence to back it up as well as interact with their classmates using Accountable Talk. In math, we wrapped up instruction working on fractions and understanding parts of a whole as well as a fraction greater than one. Now is an even greater opportunity to have fun practicing this skill with your scholar by measuring while cooking or baking a special meal or treat at home! Our focus moving forward has been on the metric and custom units of measurement as we continue to review all past skills and concepts.

In science, we wrapped up changes to the land caused by weathering and erosion, and will further our focus of instruction on different kinds of energy and heat flow while we incorporate a review of previous concepts and standards taught. Continue to practice identifying scientific changes in your home environment for a greater understanding! In social studies we will also be learning about resources in Florida, reproduction in plants and life cycles. Please continue to encourage your child to work on i-Ready each night because it reinforces the skills taught in 4th grade.

Parents, the fourth grade team thank you for your patience and constant support during this extraordinary time!

Fifth Grade Updates

Our fifth-grade scholars continue making steady academic progress as we embark on this adventure into the land of online schooling together.

In ELA we continue to work on past standards as we strive for 100% mastery, incorporating a variety of texts in comprehension building activities to help prepare for 6th grade. In math, we are continuing to work on fractions with like and unlike denominators as well as fractions greater than one, as we spiral review through past standards and prepare for our transition into 6th grade. In science we are reviewing standards taught in all grades Kinder through 5th as we introduce extensions in learning for a greater understanding of these concepts.

For our families here are a few simple things to consider from the 5th grade team as we move forward. Maintain a Routine; set a schedule (including breaks) for when online tasks should be completed daily. Organize; yourself to participate in the learning with your scholar, create a space for learning using checklists or calendars as needed. Support; let your learner know it's not just the teacher that is there to help them. Patience; we are ALL figuring this out together and will work though all the obstacles we come across. Problem Solve; do NOT give up, if it doesn't work one way, try something else. And lastly, Question; ask if you are not sure. The fifth-grade team is here to assist you in any way we can. This experience is new and we WILL meet and face every challenge head on, TOGETHER we can make it happen for our scholars!

Guidance News

Sea Castle Scholars as we move through these final months of school, it is important to maintain your character and continue to focus on important traits that show what amazing scholars you are.

Our character trait for the month of April is TOLERANCE, and what better time to practice this skill then now as we move through these uncertain times. The SEL (Social Emotional Learning) standard related to this character trait is Relationship skills (developing sympathy and/or acceptance of others), we can continue to practice this by reading about autism during the month of April for Autism Awareness Month, and working to understand the difficult times many of us, and those around us, are experiencing. The information here outlines and defines ou traits and standards.

What is **CHARACTER**?

The combination of traits, qualities, feelings and behaviors that distinguish an individual. It is based on universal principles, moral values and integrity.

TOLERANCE:

Recognizing and respecting differences, values, and beliefs of other people. The act of tolerating something. Willingness to, sympathy for, or acceptance of feelings, habits, or beliefs that are different from your own.

What is **SEL**?

Social-Emotional learning is the process of acquiring a set of skills to manage emotions, set and achieve positive goals, show empathy for others, establish and maintain positive relationships, and make responsible decisions.
