Kindergarten Updates

Our Kindergartners ROCK at distance and virtual learning! Kindergarten ended the third quarter with a love for reading and continued that focus into the fourth quarter. In exploring our love for reading, we learned about the relationships between illustrations in stories and how to compare and contrast the adventures and experiences of characters in familiar stories.

Parents, please continue to read to your child every night. Practice activities are available through the Scholastic W.O.R.D. App in your child's Clever account. Continue to practice and run-through the Dolch primer and pre-premier sight words (memory words or high frequency words.) Familiarizing your child with these words will help them become more fluent in reading. In math we learned geometry of two and three dimensional shapes. We were introduced to the fundamentals of measurement and learned how to classify and sort data. We encourage parents to continue having your child practice addition sentences and work to practice subtraction.

In science we learned about the changes in matter and the movement or particles giving us solids, liquids, and gases. In social studies we continued to identify items and holidays in our culture. We began studying economics identifying the needs and wants that go into an economic system. As we venture into summer and prepare to celebrate our Independence Day we are discussing patriotism and all that it means.

At home, continue encouraging your child to read, practice sight words, and access Scholastic W.O.R.D. We appreciate your continued support and wish our scholars the best this summer!

This will increase their comprehension.

In math, our scholars finished the last chapters of the Go Math series with a focus on representing and Interpreting data, basic concepts of geometry and reasoning with shapes and their attributes.

In science, we learned about the benefits and disadvantages of the Sun, materials on Earth's surface, plant parts and fast and slow changes to land.

In social studies, our students learned about holidays we celebrate, American symbols, and diversity.

Fourth Grade Updates

Fourth grade scholars and parents, we have survived our distance learning experience and are headed into summer! We would like to give you some tips on how to help reduce the "Summer Slide." "Experts agree that children who read during the summer gain reading skills, while those who do not often slide backward." Encourage your child to read 20 minutes per day or 2-3 hours per week. Reading 4 to 6 chapter books during the summer has been shown to prevent reading loss! Another option can be listening to audiobooks. Discuss the books with your child and ask questions about what they read. Math in 5th grade will be a challenge. Give your child a head start by strengthening multiplication skills by multiplying 3-digit by 3-digit numbers. Also, brush up

on those long division skills as well. Learning place value up to the hundred millions place will be helpful. Perhaps, use magazines or newspapers for scavenger hunts to find challenging words or math concepts. Cook with your child. Have your child follow a recipe because this enhances both reading and math. Lastly, iReady will be available to your child over the summer. It is important to spend at least 60 minutes per week in reading and math to review skills taught in school.
