A few important reminders to ensure the safety and well-being of our students: 1. Morning Drop-Off: Students should not be dropped off on campus before 7:15 AM as there is no adult supervision available before this time.

2. Early Release Pickup: As per District policy, please refrain from picking up students for early release after 1:45 PM.

3. Off-Campus Pickup: For the safety of all students, kindly avoid picking up your child outside the school gates. We have no jurisdiction off-campus, and it poses a risk as they would be unsupervised.

4. "See/Hear Something, Say Something": Consistently discuss this important principle with your child to promote a safe and secure environment.

5. Positive Social Media Use: Encourage your children to use social media positively. Remind them not to use it to defame or embarrass their fellow students, as such actions can have lasting emotional consequences.

6. Medication: If your child needs to take medication (including inhalers) during the school day, please visit the school nurse. There are essential forms that must be completed to ensure safe and proper administration. Your cooperation in promptly completing these forms is crucial for the well-being of your child and their peers.

Your cooperation in reinforcing these guidelines is greatly appreciated, contributing to the overall safety and well-being of our school community.

DISCIPLINE CORNER

In this edition of Discipline Corner, we want to shed light on an important aspect of school discipline – expulsion. While it's a topic we hope to address as infrequently as possible, it's essential to understand the process and reasons behind it.

WHAT IS EXPULSION?

Expulsion is the most serious disciplinary action a school can take, resulting in a student's removal from the school for up to one school year. This decision is never made lightly and only occurs in rare circumstances where a student's behavior poses a severe and ongoing threat to the safety and well-being of others.

WHY DOES EXPULSION OCCUR?

Expulsion may be considered when a student engages in actions such as:


- ϕ Weapons possession
- ϕ Severe and ongoing bullying
- ϕ Drug-related offenses
- ${\it 0}$ Other egregious misconduct



Our goal is to avoid expulsion and provide a safe, supportive, and inclusive learning community for all students. McNicol Middle is dedicated to providing a safe and respectful environment as we encourage all students to practice the 5 B's.

We emphasize that expulsion is not meant to be punitive but to ensure the safety and well-being of all students. Let's unite and work together as we practice the 5 B's on a daily basis.
