






2019-2020 Superintendent's Advanced Placement Art Exhibition

Urban Teacher Academy Program (UTAP)

The Urban Teacher Academy Program (UTAP) is a club on campus that introduces integrated teaching experiences to students and takes them through the process of the work that the education profession requires. In the beginning of the year we learn how to create lessons plans and strategies to meet the needs of each student. During class time, we do a variety of team building exercises that are designed to help us work better together. In this class we spend most of our time communicating with each other, which is extremely important because it helps us with everything that we do. UTAP teaches students leadership, work skills, and communication skills which are very necessary for the future.

One of the main components of this program is our field experience trips. Every Tuesday and Wednesday, we go to two different elementary schools: Pines Lakes Elementary and Lakeside Elementary and work with either kindergarten, first, second, or third graders. Upper level presents push-in lessons while level one participates in a peer-mentoring reading program. Upper-level UTAPers go into a kindergarten, or first grade class and present lessons they have created that are based in reading, math, or science. The elementary school teachers have the opportunity to request lessons based on the curriculum that they are already teaching and then get to grade the high-schoolers based on their performance within their classrooms. The Teen Trendsetters program, which is sponsored by the Barbra Bush Foundation is a one-on-one peer mentoring program with either first, second, or third grade students. High school mentors support students with their reading skills and work with them as much as possible to help them reach their highest potential in school. All UTAP students also work with ninth and tenth graders through Peter's Peeps which is an additional peer mentoring program that UTAP runs on campus in partnership with mentors from Peer Counseling and Student Government. We meet with these students every other Thursday and Friday and make sure to provide as much help and support as we possibly can to help them thrive and become better as they navigate through high school.

Here in UTAP we are constantly planning activities and team-building exercises for the club and for the students at the elementary schools. One of our biggest yearly events is Trunk or Treat. This takes place in October near Halloween and we invite clubs from our school and the kids from Pines Lakes and Lakeside Elementary. We work hard towards making Trunk or Treat enjoyable and fun for everyone. Each car that we use is decorated by the members of UTAP and other clubs that join in the fun. We all use our creative process to come up with fun and immersive games for everyone to enjoy along with the decorative process of each car. Everyone who participates and comes to Trunk or Treat leaves with a smile, a happy heart, and A LOT of candy.

A TWO DAY KICK-OFF EVENT!

Peter's Peeps is a peer mentoring program that is run by Mrs. Knapp and UTAP with the help of Peer Counseling and SGA students who mentor 9th or 10th grade students. This mentoring program is designed to help build relationships between mentors and mentees so they can have additional support and help. Every other Thursday and Friday during their study hall period, mentors from these three clubs meet with their 9th or 10 grade mentees and check up on how they are doing and make sure everything is going well.

To start off each semester, we have a kickoff with all the mentors and mentees where our intention is to have fun and get to do activities that everyone will enjoy and look forward to doing. We also have snacks, play games and listen to music while interacting with each other. During our first kickoff we got to know our mentees and do a couple of team building exercises that helped us get comfortable with each other for the rest of the year. We all enjoy Peter's Peeps and working with our mentees; we are looking forward to our next semester kickoff in February!!!





What's Happening

Online Educational Resources

Students use a variety of online platforms to deepen and enrich their understanding of academic content. These resources are all available from home! Students can continue using these online resources to receive additional support at home at their own pace. Ask your child's teacher how these resources can best be utilized at home!





Unit tests are a significant part of a student's overall class average in Algebra 1 and Geometry. In the last two weeks, students have taken their first round of rigorous unit tests. Since then, all students were presented with an opportunity to remediate (repair) and enrich (further grow) their understanding of the content. Speak with your child about their grades on their recent unit tests and discuss if the remediation and enrichment opportunities are right for your child. Together, we can ensure that your child succeeds.



The focus in 9th and 10th grade ELA has been preparing our students to have success on the FSA exam. Teachers have worked on strengthening skills, comprehension, and test taking strategies. In 11th and 12th grade, students work on strengthening their reading comprehension and writing skills to achieve high marks on the SAT. Teachers in the ELA department leverage online resources like Khan Academy to reach every student where they are.



After School Tutoring Available

The **National Honor Society** students provide 1 on 1 tutoring to all students after school in the media center on Tuesdays. The **Math Honor Society (Mu Alpha Theta)** assists on Thursdays to give math focused assistance to students.

In order to be eligible you must have a minimum of 3.0 GPA & take the P.E.R.T. exam in Math/Reading. We are offering those 9th & 10th grade students who qualify a free opportunity to take the exam at FHS on Wednesday January 22nd, Students can also take the exam at B.C. (offered multiple dates & times Registration & fees listed on their website)
- Florida Department of Education accepts P.E.R.T. Math exam results with a score of 97 and higher to fulfill the Algebra 1 EOC graduation requirement for those students who did not pass the exam. This requirement is only for those students entering 9th grade in 2017 or prior. The exam will be given to those 11th and 12th graders on Thursday January 23rd.

How do I apply?

Common App: The Common Application is an undergraduate college admission application that applicants may use to apply to any of more than 800 member colleges and universities in 49 states and the District of Columbia, as well as in Canada, China, Japan, and many European countries.



Coalition App: The Coalition Application is a college application platform that is currently accepted by over 140 schools.

Institutional App: An application done through the institution's website.

Types of Institutions:

College's & The "2+2 system" in Florida

Florida's higher education system is designed to allow students to successfully pursue a bachelor's degree by first earning an associate in arts degree at a Florida college and then transferring to a four-year institution. This approach to earning a four-year degree is commonly referred to as the "2+2 system". **Example:** Broward College, Miami Dade College, Valencia College

4-Year Institution

Public universities, private universities, liberal arts colleges and career colleges offering bachelor's degrees all fall into the category of 4-year colleges and universities.

Example: Florida Atlantic University, University of Florida, Nova Southeastern University

HBCU

Historically black colleges and universities (HBCUs) are institutions of higher education in the United States that were established before the Civil Rights Act of 1964 with the intention of primarily serving the African - American community.

Example: Florida A&M University, Spelman College, Howard University

HSI

A Hispanic-Serving Institution, or HSI, is defined in federal law (the Higher Education Opportunity Act, Title V, 2008) as an accredited, degree-granting, public or private nonprofit institution of higher education with 25% or more total undergraduate Hispanic full-time equivalent (FTE) student enrollment.

Example: Florida International University, University of Central Florida, Barry University

Technical College

These schools are sometimes referred to as career colleges, which means the programs are all career focused in nature.

Example: Sheridan Technical College
