In the unit about buildings, we will talk about how buildings are constructed and what people do inside them. This is a great opportunity to develop conversation and vocabulary about buildings. With the exercise unit, we will explore questions such as "How do our bodies work when we exercise?" and "What do our bodies need in order to move and exercise?" These questions are great opportunities to talk together and work out together. Don't forget to read to your child each day!

Pre-Kindergarten

"Top of the morning to you!" from Peters Elementary Pre-K Department. March is here bringing springtime fun with it. Our lucky lasses and lads continue learning through multisensory approaches. Through role play, dances, and handson-activities, our mighty scholars will explore popular spring theme crafts, books, and songs. Just like little leprechauns, our students and staff keep skipping along on our pre-k adventure as our students learn through play. Teachers continue to be busy planning daily routines, collecting data, and having fun with the children in the classroom and on the playground. Students will be working on their vocabulary, pre-academics, and attending skills. In a hop, skip, and a jump.... Spring break will be here at the end of the March rainbow. Speaking of spring and rainbows, several Pre-K teachers are focusing on weather and the season of spring this month. It's always a great day to be a Panda.

As parents, you are your child's lifelong teacher. We encourage families to read lots of books, play simple games, give lots of hugs and kisses to your kiddos. Take time to have tea parties, build forts, and go to parks/beaches/nature preserves. Make

Kindergarten

Welcome to the Marvelous month of March! Here is what we will be learning in ELA English Language Arts. In Unit, Holidays and Celebrations our students will be expounding their knowledge on comparing different holiday traditions & celebrations from around the world. Students will develop an understanding why and how we honor people who have made a positive influence in the world through celebrations and holidays. Students will also have fun learning about the diverse cultures around the world and the importance of celebrating with family and friends.

In Math, students are learning new math concepts using number operations 11-19. We will be working on counting to answer "how many" and arranging numbers 11-20. Composing and decomposing numbers 11-19 into ten & ones. Students will use math manipulatives and drawings on paper and white boards and record equations such as 10+5=15 or 15=10+5 to gain a clear knowledge of the numbers being composed of ten and ones.

In Science, we will be discussing Patterns in the sky; students will learn about night and day, why do we see objects like the sun and clouds in the sky during the day, and why do we see the moon and stars in the sky at night? Sometimes we may see the moon during the day. Why does this happen? These are questions that we will be answering with our scholars. We can't wait to continue to teach them all about this amazing science topic!

In social studies, we will be learning about geography which is the study of places on earth. Students will use words to describe their location, as well as the importance and functions of using maps and globes. We will also discuss what landforms are and how animals and people use them in everyday life. Now that winter is over, we can enjoy the beautiful spring weather!

Happy Saint Patrick's Day! Lastly, we are so thankful to continue to help support your child's academic and overall development in kindergarten!

First Grade

The third quarter is in full swing, and we could not be prouder of our amazing first-grade Pandas! They are working hard to increase fluency and comprehension in reading as they prepare for PM3 STAR testing. As always, thanks for supporting their learning at home by completing homework and reading at least 20 minutes per night.

This month in Benchmark, students will be reading stories that explore why knowledge of the past is important to understand the present and to plan for the future. They will also learn about the tools people use to organize and understand events of the past. They will be introduced to long (o), long (i), and long (e) spelling patterns and will practice decoding and encoding vowel team words. Writing projects will focus on writing expository "How to" pieces using a text and providing facts.

In math, students will begin Topic 12, Time & Money. They will learn the value of coins and bills, and how to tell and write time to the hour and half hour. Please continue to complete nightly math homework with your child. The extra practice at home ensures they master the concepts and skills being taught in the classroom.

Everyone thoroughly enjoyed the field trip to see a live performance of **Ada Twist, Scientist!** Thanks to the SEAS program for hosting us for the performance and for the actors' workshop that followed.

Mandatory Uniform School

Peters Elementary has adopted a school wide mandatory unified dress program. As specified in School **Board Policy #5309**, violations of the uniform policy shall be subject to the same consequences as violations of the dress code of the Code of Student Conduct. The school uniform will consist of the following:

Bottoms: Navy or khaki pants, capris, shorts, skirts, shorts, or jumpers. No jeans. Tops: White, red, or blue short and long sleeve collared (polo-style) shirts. No emblems or designer labels, except the Peters

Elementary logo. Peters t shirts, which can be purchased from the PTA, are also allowed. Shoes: Sneakers, athletic shoes, leather shoes, boat shoes with enclosed toes or backs. No sling-backs, clogs, or open toed shoes. Parents may request an exemption for their children not to wear uniforms within the first ten days of a student's enrollment. Parents must contact the school office to receive an Application of Exemption in such cases. Exemptions will only be granted if they conform to the requirements of School Board Policy #5309.

Late Arrivals Process

Attendance is a vital part of your child's education process. It is important for your child to be in school and on time to help maximize academic success. After 8:10 AM, parents must come into the front office to sign-in late students.

Walker Gate and Car Riders

The walker gate on 68th Avenue is only for students walking to school. Car riders are not to be dropped off or picked up at the walker gate. Parents dropping off car riders are to enter through the second gate on 70th Avenue, go around the loop let students out on the sidewalks where school staff will guide them through the entry gate. For the safety of students, we ask that you stay alert (no cell phones) and do not cut through the line.





The Tracking Features:

Shows the real-time location of your child's bus on a map

Gives scheduled and actual arrival times at home and school for AM, Mid-day, and PM routes

Provides push and email notifications when the bus is near



Sign Up Instructions for Parents:

- Download Here Comes the Bus app or visit: www.herecomesthebus.com
- 2. Click "Sign Up", then click "Continue".
- 3. Click "I have the Code".
- Enter your email address, First Name, Last Name and School District Code (87599).
 Accept the Terms and Conditions, then click "Continue".
- 5. Press Confirm the district displayed is "Broward County Public Schools".
- 6. Create your password. Repeat your password. Press "Confirm Password" on the screen when complete.
- 7. If successful, you will be directed to the **Thank You** screen. At that time, please check your email inbox for an email from noreply@synovia.com.
- 8. Open this email and click the "Activate My Account" link. Once completed, close the browser. You may now open the app and sign in with your email address and newly created password.

Adding a Student:

- 1. Access the Here Comes the Bus app.
- 2. Click the Student icon.
- 3. Click the Add Student button, then enter their last name and Student ID. Click Submit.
- 4. Repeat this process for additional students.
