



HIGH SCHOOL VS. MIDDLE SCHOOL

- 8 classes One being Study Hall
- 92 minutes per class
- All Classes = 1 Credit
- Online course required for graduation (BVED.net)
 Some blended classes satisfy the online component, check with your counselor.
- All credits count towards graduation and all grades will be on your transcript (must maintain a 2.0 GPA or higher to graduate)
- More academic classes and electives to choose from
- Opportunity to earn college credit for FREE
- Larger campus
- 40 Hours of community service required for graduation (250 for the Silver Cord)
- Greater variety of clubs and sports

Honors vs. Advanced Placement

HONORS

- When you pass an honors class, you earn credit.

-Earning a "C" or higher in an honors class, can give you an extra point towards your weighted GPA.

-Workload will be heavier than a regular class.

-Requires more Independence -Quicker Pace


Advanced Placement

- When you pass an AP class, you earn credit.
- Earning a "C" or higher in an AP class can give you two extra points towards your weighted GPA; you must take and do well on the AP exam.
- Scoring a level 3 or Higher on your AP Exam, can potentially earn you College Credit for the course.
- Workload/content will be a lot heavier than an honors class.
- Independent Study Skills
- Moves at a fast pace
- College Readiness
- More Weight on Assessments/Tests

HOW TO REGISTER FOR CLASSES THE COURSE SELECTION CARD

Academic Courses (Classes 1 – 4):

English:	Select 1 English Course	
 Mathematics: 	Select 1 Math Course	
Science:	Select 1 Science Course	
 Social Studies: 	Select 1 Social Studies Course	

All core courses require teacher's approval.

Elective Courses (Classes 5 - 8):

- 5. Elective
- 6. Double Math or Another Elective
- 7. Personal Fitness/PE
- 8. Study Hall

Remember: The following courses take up 2 periods!
✓ Algebra 1 and Foundations of Math
