Review the Signpost Definitions & Questions below:

Contrasts & Contradictions: When a character does or says something different than what you would expect, ask yourself: "Why is the character doing or saying that?"

Aha Moment: When a character realized or suddenly understands something, ask yourself: "How might this change things?"

<u>Tough Questions:</u> When a characterasks himself/herself a very difficult question, ask yourself: "What does this question make me wonder?"

<u>Words of the Wiser:</u> When an older or wiser character offers serious advice to the main character, ask yourself: "What is the life lesson, and how mightit affect the character?"

Again & Again: When a word, phrase, image, or situation is mentioned over and over, ask yourself: "Why does this keep happening?"

<u>Memory Moment:</u> When the author chooses to interrupt the action to tell about a memory, ask yourself: "Why is this memory important?"
