SPOTLIGHT ON SCIENCE


FEATURING WORK BY MRS, FARKAS, MS. IHAMAKI, MRS. MAIRAJUDDIN, AND MRS. SHOON'S SCIENCE CLASSES

Our Science teachers are raising the bar on hybrid learning! These rock star teachers have been doing some amazing lessons with their classes.

MRS. SHOON - 6TH GRADE

Mrs. Shoon's students created the layers of the earth using vanilla pudding. Students, at home and in the classroom, were able to create the inner core, outer core, mantle, and crust. It was a fun and delicious way to explore the layers of the earth!







MRS. MAIRAJUDDIN - 7TH GRADE

Mrs. Mairajuddin's students started their Ecology unit by taking virtual field trips to various ecosystems. Using the VR capable Oculus Go, students traveled to Yellowstone National Park and observed an underwater ecosystem forming beneath an abandoned oil rig. The Oculus Go enabled them to fully experience these habitats and look at the organisms up close. It was a great opening to this new unit!





SPOTLIGHT ON SCIENCE

MS. IHAMAKI - 7TH GRADE

Mrs. Ihamaki's classes analyzed population graphs, collect data to generate their own population graph, and experience limiting factors and their impact on carrying capacity in a small deer population. Students were able to identify, explain, and evaluate the impact that different limiting factors have on the population of organisms including food, water, shelter, predation, human interference, changes in birth and death rate, changes in immigration and emigration, disease, and reproduction.







MRS. FARKAS - 8TH GRADE

A group of Mrs. Farkas's 8th-grade science students has been working with NASA scientists! Together, they are involved with developing fresh vegetables for Astronauts in their Growing Beyond Earth project.





AT HOME DAILY HEALTH SCREENING



Broward County Public Schools is committed to the health and safety of our students, our staff and our community. The District has instituted enhanced cleaning schedules, staggered work schedules and continues to reduce the number of people in our facilities to promote physical distancing.

In order to enter Broward County Public Schools facilities, all students, parents/caregivers, and employees should answer the following self-assessment questions at home each morning prior to coming to school:

DAILY HEALTH SELF ASSESSMENT QUESTIONS:



Do you feel warm, have a fever or elevated temperature (100.4), or have the chills?



Do you have a persistent cough, runny nose or sore throat?



Have you recently had a loss of taste or smell?



Has anyone in your household tested positive for COVID-19?



Have you been in close, unprotected contact with anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19?

(spent longer than 15 minutes within six feet of someone who was sick with a fever and cough or confirmed/suspected of having COVID-19)



Are you feeling sick or ill today?



Are you awaiting test results for COVID-19?



Have you been told to self-quarantine or self-isolate by a doctor or the Florida Department of Health?



If your child can answer "NO" to all of these questions, they may proceed to school.



If your child answered "YES" to any of these questions, you must contact the school nurse for further guidance.
