BEFORE SCHOOL

To ensure you are not sending a sick child to campus, we encourage you to ask these questions every morning:

- › Does my child feel warm, have a fever or elevated temperature (100.4), or have the chills?
- › Does my child have a persistent cough, runny nose or sore throat?
- › Has my child recently experienced a loss of taste or smell?
- › Has anyone in my household tested positive for COVID-19?
- › Has my child been in close, unprotected contact with anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19 (spent longer than 15 minutes within 6 feet of someone who was sick with a fever and cough or confirmed/suspected of having COVID-19)?
- › Is my child feeling otherwise sick or ill today?
- › Is my child awaiting test results for COVID-19?
- › Has my child tested positive for COVID-19?
- › Has my child been told to self-quarantine or self-isolate by a doctor or District administrator?



IF ANY OF THESE ARE OCCURRING, THE EXPECTATION IS THAT YOUR CHILD WILL STAY HOME AND ACCESS E-LEARNING AT HOME

BRING TO SCHOOL

District or personal laptop with charger – fully charged

- › Headphones/Earbuds
- › 1-2 Masks
- › Book(s) to read during Arrival/Dismissal
- › Water Bottle labeled with their name (students will not be able to use the water fountain)
- › Materials and books provided at the beginning of e-Learning

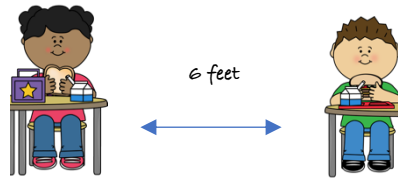


- Folder with Paper/Journal
 - Pencils, Crayons/Markers
 - Personal Hand Sanitizer (classroom also has hand sanitizer)
- › Please keep all non-essential items, such as toys and electronics, at home.
- › Students will use only their own personal supplies.

ARRIVAL

In order to support our health and safety measures, parents and visitors will not be allowed on campus during Arrival.

- › Arrival is between 7:30-8:00am
- › Breakfast is free for all students interested until December.
- › Breakfast will be available for pick up upon entering school and students will proceed to their classroom to eat outside their classroom.
- › All students will sit physically distant from each other in hallways outside of classroom until 8:00.
- › Students are to bring reading materials to read while waiting for school to begin. Remember to keep all toys at home.



LUNCH

If interested, students can receive a free lunch in the cafeteria through December.

- › Students will eat lunch in the cafeteria each day with social distancing protocols in place.
- › Cafeteria will be sanitized in between groups entering for lunch.

PHYSICAL ACTIVITY

- › Playground equipment will not be used at this time.
- › Predetermined outdoor activities will reflect current CDC guidelines.
- › Students will be provided daily opportunities for physical activity with their classes.



DISMISSAL

- › 1:45 pm ASD Special Programs Car riders will be dismissed in the front loop
- › K-2 Car Riders will be dismissed by the side loop (off Three Village Rd by the park)
- › 3-5 Car Riders will be dismissed in the front loop

VISITORS ON CAMPUS

- › Parents, visitors and volunteers will not be admitted on campus at this time.
 - Conferences and meetings (IEP) will be held through TEAMS.
- › No deliveries of items to students during the school day. (i.e. lunches, snacks, backpacks)

SANITATION

- › Each classroom will be provided with PPE supplies (Sanitizer, Wipes, Gloves, Masks)
- › Custodians will sanitize high frequency touch points and used areas throughout the day (Doorknobs, Railings, Clinic, Group bathrooms)
- › Students will be provided wipes to wipe down their desks daily.
- › Hand sanitizer will be provided; however, students may bring their own.
- › Frequent handwashing and sanitizing will occur throughout the day.



SECURITY

- › Our SRO and Campus Monitor will be present on campus during school hours.
- › Daily perimeter patrol, campus monitoring, front office presence and student escorts will be conducted throughout the day.
- › Students, Staff and Teachers will be required to wear ID badges.



MASKS

- › Facial coverings must be worn at all times while on campus and school buses.
- › Face covering should cover both the nose and mouth and fit snugly against the sides of the face with no gaps.
- › Masks may be taken off to eat snacks and lunch.
- › Masks may be taken off during physical activity if physical distancing is in place.
- › School will provide disposable masks as needed.

TECHNOLOGY

- › Students are to bring fully charged district issued or personal laptops to school with chargers.
- › K-2 students will leave their laptop in their classroom after the first day, but Grades 3-5 will travel back and forth from home and school with the laptop.
- › If students have not previously checked out a school laptop or brought a person device, one will be provided when they get to school.

UNIFORMS

Students are required to wear their uniforms daily.

- › Red, white or blue Polo Shirt
- › Solid Navy or khaki bottoms: Shorts, Pants or Skirt
- › Country Isles t-shirts are also admissible



AFTERCARE

- › CIE Aftercare will continue to be our provider on campus for aftercare services from 2:00 pm – 6:00 pm.
- › Registration online is required.
- › Space is limited.
- › Health and safety measures will be the same as the school day.
- › Peter Sanchez and Randy Rollins are our Aftercare Supervisors



ADDITIONAL SAFETY MEASURES

- › Hallways and walkways have been marked to indicate 6-feet apart for students.
- › Posters and signage have been placed throughout the campus for social distance, masks and hand-washing reminder.
- › Classrooms have been set-up to facilitate social distancing guidelines.
- › Air filters have been upgraded to the highest level available for our HVAC system.
- › Isolation room has been added to quarantine any student or staff member who may be exhibiting symptoms.
- › A nurse has been assigned to our school.
